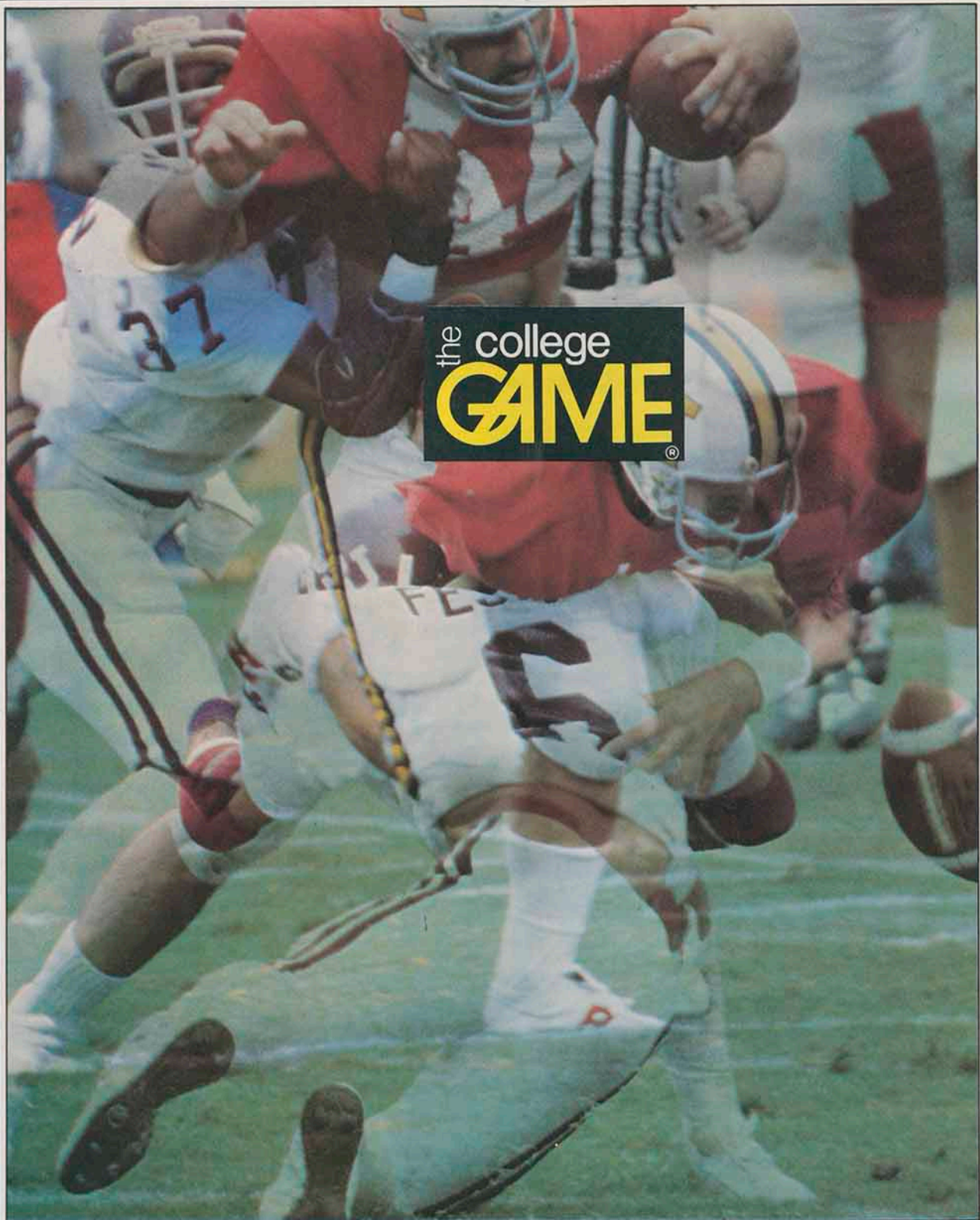

If tonight's game between Pittsburg State University and Southwest Missouri is anything like last year's game, it should go right down to the wire. SWMS won last year's meeting, 41-37, after the Gorillas once held leads of 27-7 and 30-14. Pitt State leads the series between the two schools, 30-19-3.

The Gorillas come into tonight's contest, fresh off 1 33-7 victory over Northwest Missouri State. The Gorillas received a fine performance from junior quarterback, Craig Kelly last week, as he completed six of 10 passes for 125 yards and two touchdowns. PSU rolled up 423 total offense yards with 275 of those coming on the ground. On defense, the Gorillas held the Bearcats to just 129 total yards and forced four turnovers.

SWMS is coming off a 17-15 upset loss to Missouri Southern last week. The Bears finished in third place in the MIAA conference a year ago at 3-3 and were 7-4 overall.

The Bears under head coach Rich Johannningmeier, return virtually all of their defense from last season and will be led on offense by first team all-conference running backs, Mark Daniels and John Gianini.

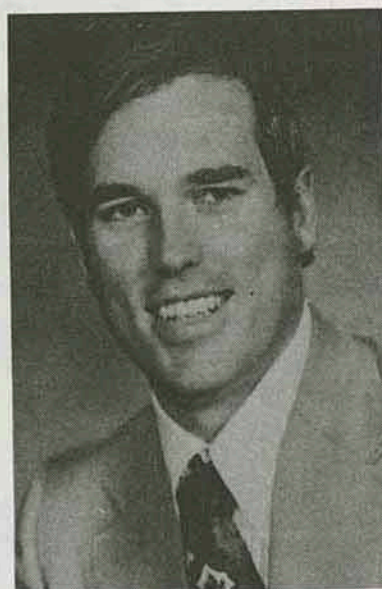

Central States Intercollegiate Conference

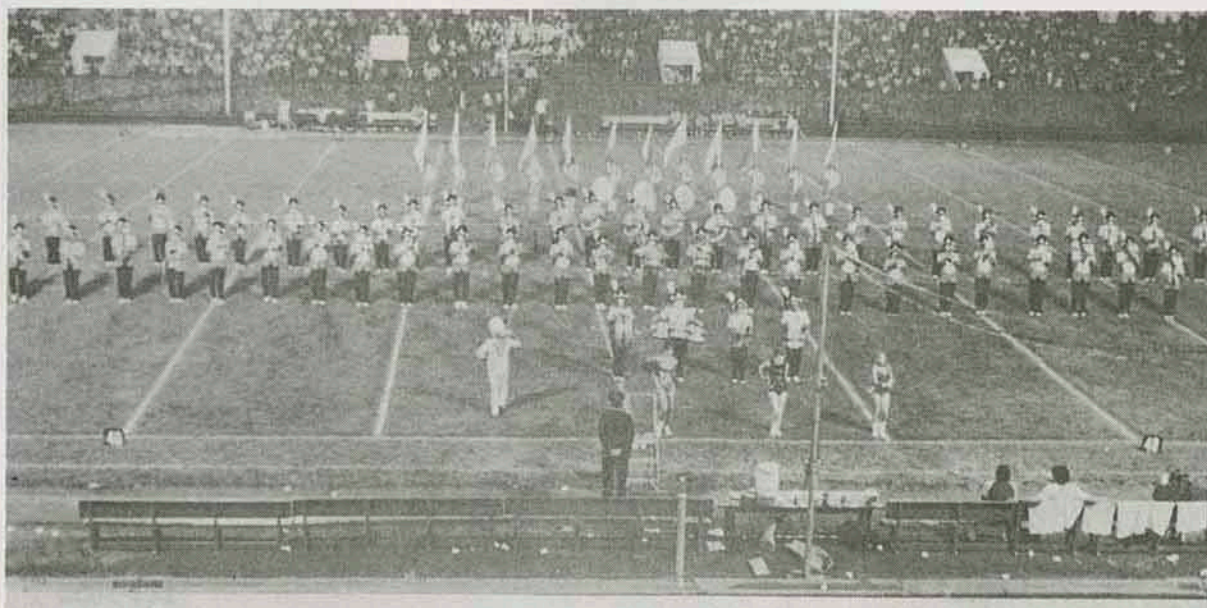

Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the four years of its existence the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1979-80 school year several athletic teams from CSIS schools finished among the top ten in NAIA national competition. The 1980-81 school years promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.

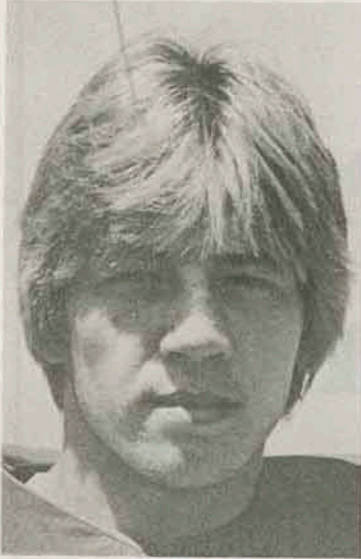

MARK KILGORE



The Gorilla defense played a major role in last week's 33-7 win over Northwest Missouri State. Sparking that defense was sophomore linebacker Mark Kilgore of Richmond, Missouri.

Against the Bearcats, Kilgore had 11 tackles, three solos, one forced fumble, a deflected pass and an interception.

"Mark had a very outstanding game for us," said Pitt State head coach, Ron Randleman. "Mark has good reactions and good speed and really is just one outstanding football player."

GENE WAYENBERG



Grabbing the spotlight last week in offense was junior wide receiver, Gene Wayenberg of Mission, Ks. A transfer from Coffeyville Community College, the NWMS game was his first in a Pitt State uniform and probably one he will never forget.

In his debut, Wayenberg hauled in three passes for a total of 119 yards. One of those receptions was a 92 yard touchdown reception from quarterback Craig Kelly, which set a new school record.

"Gene made some very key catches for us and also had some key blocks as well," Randleman said.

"Gene is an excellent receiver who possesses both good speed and great hands," he added.

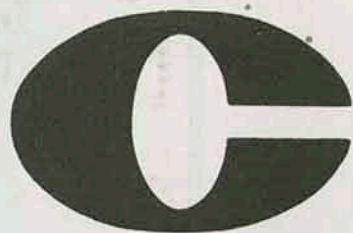
