




Tonight's game between the Pittsburg State Gorillas and the Fort Hays State Tigers, features two teams looking to get back on the winning track. Both teams are coming off tough defeats last week. The Gorillas dropped a 38-36 decision to Washburn University last Saturday while the Tigers were defeated by Wayne State, 34-30.

Coming into tonight's contest, the Gorillas are now 1-1 in CSIC play and 3-2 overall. Fort Hays, meanwhile, is now 0-1-1 in CSIC play and 1-2-1 overall.

In their loss to Washburn, the Gorillas managed to rack up 301 yards rushing while holding the Ichabods to -22 yards on the ground. Leading the ground attack was all-American running back, Richard Overton, Boonville senior, who rushed for 109 yards on 27 attempts. Fullback, Stan Patton, Monett junior, picked up 103 yards on 18 carries and quarterback, Bill Wachter, Pittsburg senior, finished with 89 yards on 16 carries.

Overton has now rushed for 475 yards on the year in 114 attempts and has also scored six touchdowns. He is within 736 yards of reaching the 4,000 yard mark.

The Tigers, under head coach Bobby Thompson, returned 31 lettermen and 13 starters from last year's team that went 3-4 in CSIC play and 5-6 overall.

Leading the Tiger offense will be sophomore running back, Jeff Briggs and junior tight end, Sam Farmer. Last season as a freshman, Briggs rushed for 560 yards and scored five touchdowns. Farmer was the Tigers leading receiver in '79 with 26 receptions for 464 yards and three touchdowns.

"Crimson and Gold"

by Dr. Eva Jessye

The New Pittsburg State University
Alma Mater

Pittsburg State University's new Alma Mater, "Crimson and Gold" by Dr. Eva Jessye, was chosen from among nearly 50 entries after an 18-month search by a select committee of alumni, faculty and students. Today, October 11, 1980, marks the first time the new song has been sung by a combined group of alumni, students and faculty.

It is the first wholly original school song in the University's history. The effort was initiated by an interested faculty member and the Pitt State Senate following the renaming of the University in 1977. The new Alma Mater effort developed into separate contests, one for the lyrics and another for the music. Committee members judged the entries without knowing who submitted them.

Dr. Jessye, 85, was born and raised in southeast Kansas. She went to New York City in the early 1920s and pioneered in musical direction on Broadway, in broadcasting, movies and around the world for decades in the original, and numerous subsequent runs, of "Porgy and Bess." Returning to her native state to launch PSU's 75th anniversary year in 1978, she returned again one year later to become the University's artist-in-residence and roving ambassadoress of good will.

The musical score is written on ten staves, each with a treble clef and a key signature of one sharp (F#). The melody is composed of eighth and quarter notes, with some rests. The lyrics are written below the staves, with hyphens indicating syllables that span across multiple notes. The lyrics are as follows:




