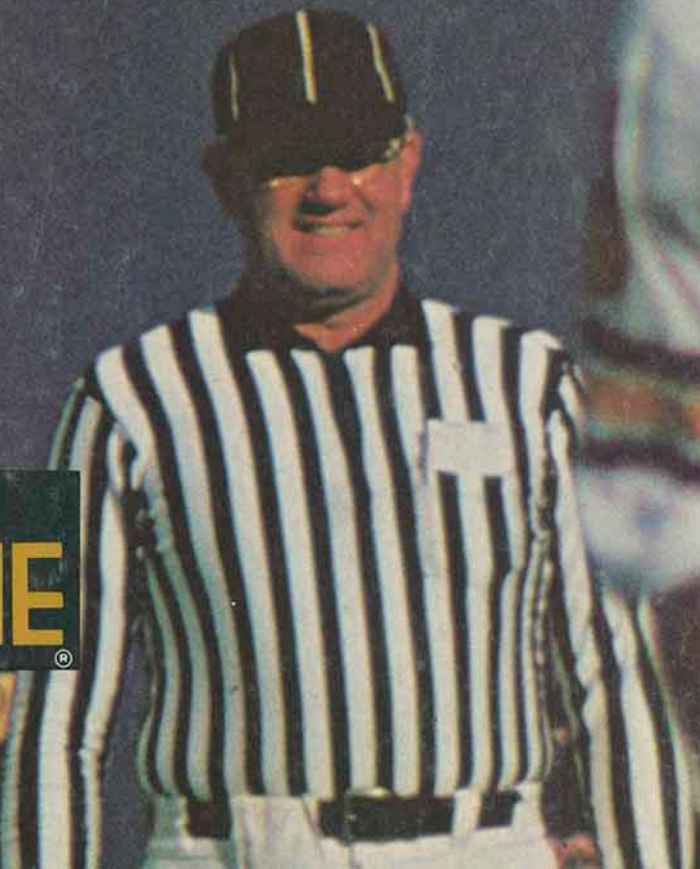

Today's game features the Emporia State Hornets, who are seeking their third win in their tenth outing this season as well as revenge for the 16-0 defeat dealt to them by the Gorillas in Emporia last year. Pittsburg State's Gorillas are coming into the game sky high, after bombing a powerful Missouri Western team 40-14 last week, behind All-American tailback Richard Overton's 257-yard rushing attack.

The series between the two teams currently stands in Pittsburg's favor with 31 wins to Emporia's 28. The two teams have tied twice.

The Gorillas boast a 6-3 overall record heading into today's game, and are second in the conference, with a 4-2 mark. A win today will clinch that second spot.

The Hornets are represented with a 2-7 overall record. They currently are 1-5 in the CSIC.

Emporia's defense will be trying to contain Overton and the Gorilla offense. On the other hand, PSU quarterbacks should beware of ESU's "heads-up" secondary, which has allowed only 131 yards per game passing.

Central States Intercollegiate Conference

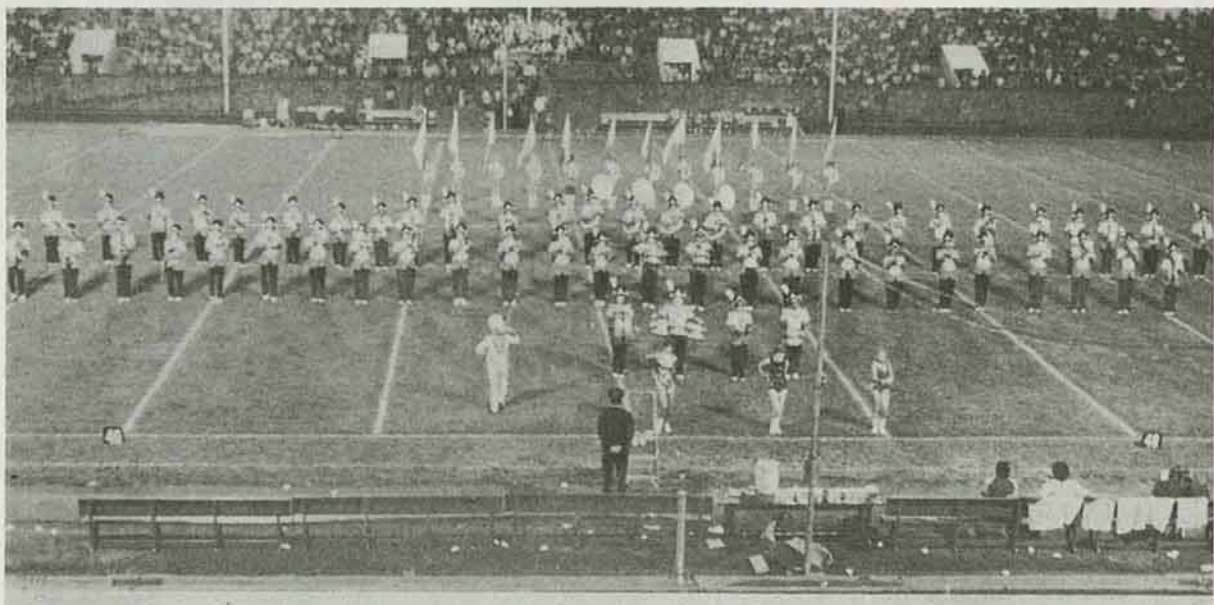
The CSIC was formed in the school year 1976-77 after the break-up of the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Ft. Hays, Pittsburg, Emporia, Washburn, and Kearney were members of the GPAC. Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the four years of its existence the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1979-80 school year several athletic teams from CSIS schools finished among the top ten in NAIA national competition. The 1980-81 school years promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.

MIKE HEGARTY

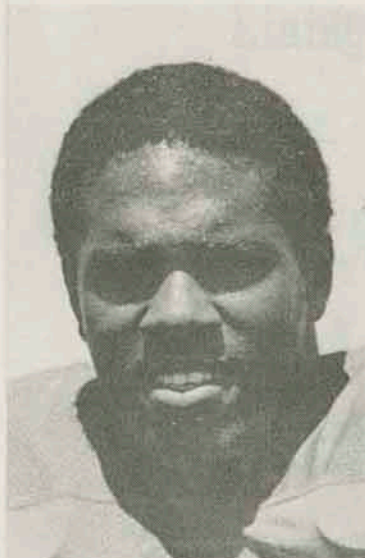

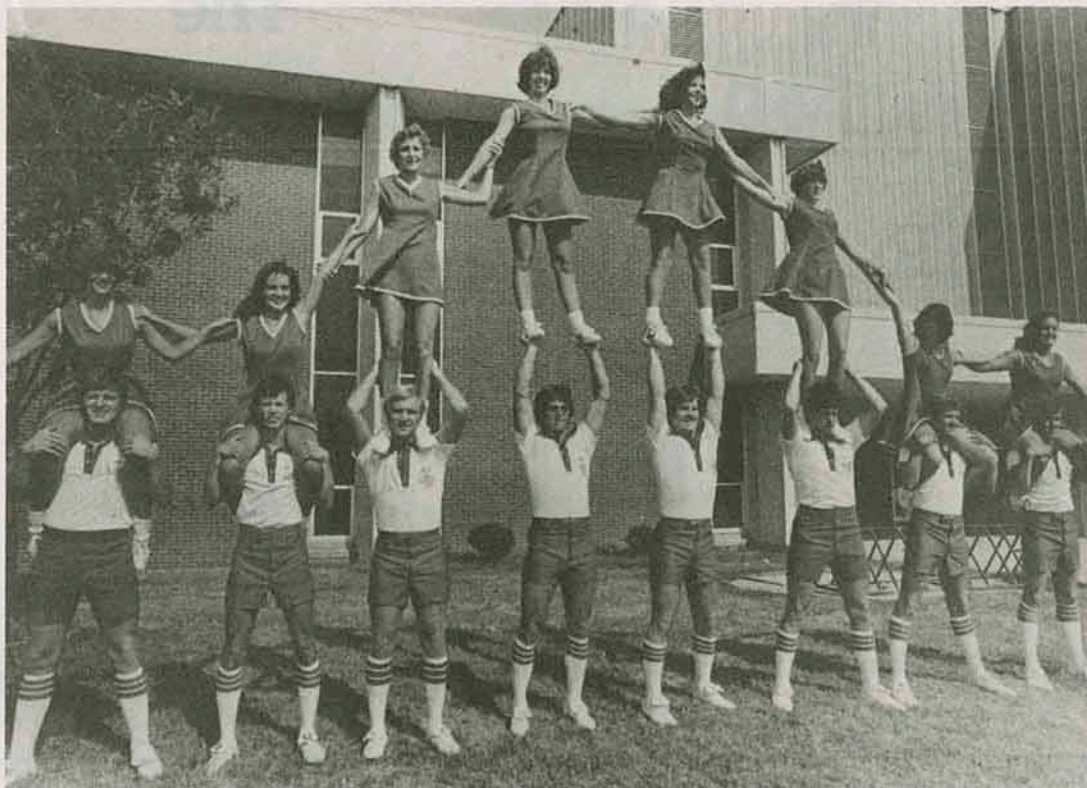

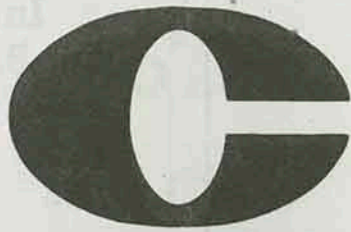
