The Story of Apple Day

On February 21, 1903, Governor William J. Bailey signed the bill creating the Kansas State Manual Training Normal School Auxiliary, the first name of what is today Pittsburg State University.

Classes began the following September in the city-owned Central School building at the northwest corner of Fifth and Walnut. Very soon the growing enrollment created a need for a larger facility. Senator Ebenezer F. Porter of Pittsburg led a successful fight for a building appropriation with the assistance of Principal Russell Station Russ, the faculty, and community leaders.

After the funding bill was passed, Clarence Price, then mayor of Pittsburg, was fined a barrel of apples for lobbying on the floor of the legislature. Senator Porter, it should be noted, graciously donated two boxes of cigars to the house for passing the bill.

Upon their triumphal return to Pittsburg, the story of the fine was told. In those days, students were disciplined for their absences. In the spirit of the celebration, Principal Russ and members of his faculty were fined a barrel of apples by the students because they had been gone to Topeka to help lobby. Thus, with the funding of the building we now call Russ Hall by the Kansas Legislature, the tradition of Apple Day was established in 1907.

Paula Baker

Paula F. Baker is the President and CEO of Freeman Health System in Joplin, Mo.

Baker joined Ozark Center, part of the Freeman Health System, in 1981, serving as CEO from 2003-2008. Through her dedication to continuous quality improvement, Ozark Center grew to become the largest and most comprehensive behavioral healthcare provider in the four-state area. She was a guiding force behind the development of Ozark Center for Autism and continues to provide executive leadership for the program. In 2008, she was named Freeman Chief Clinical Officer and assumed the helm as Freeman President and CEO on January 1, 2012.

Baker's honors include the Missouri Hospital Association 2008 Visionary Leadership Award, Joplin Tri-State Business Journal inaugural class of ten Most Influential Women, appointment to the Missouri Commission on Autism Spectrum Disorders in 2008, PSU Outstanding Alumni Award, PSU Meritorious Achievement Award, and Joplin Citizen of the Year Award.

Additionally, Baker was appointed to the Missouri Commission on Autism Spectrum Disorders in 2008. She serves on the Community Advisory Council of the Missouri Foundation for Health, the PSU Foundation Board of Trustees, and the boards of Ronald McDonald House, Arvest Bank, Talkington Foundation, Mid America Service Solutions, Aspire of Southwest Missouri, Missouri Hospital Association, Healthcare Services Group, and VHA Mid-America.

Baker holds a Bachelor's degree in Secondary Education and a Master's degree in Clinical Psychology from Pittsburg State University.

The Dr. Ralf J. Thomas Distinguished Service Award honors individuals who have demonstrated significant volunteer service to the PSU community. This year's honorees are Barry Williamson and Steve and Mary Beth Robb.

A former Vice-President at The Insurancenter in Joplin, Barry Williamson received his Bachelor of Science in Education in the Health, Human Performance & Recreation Department in 1974. In 1977, he received his Masters of Science in Health, Human Performance & Recreation. He has been recognized as an Outstanding Young Alumni, has served three terms on the Alumni Association Board and is a past president of the board as well. Barry is also a Lifetime Member of the President's Society. He has been a phonathon volunteer and currently serves on the PSU Foundation Board. Barry was a pioneer supporter and promoter of the Missouri Gorilla License Plate Program. Barry's involvement with this program was crucial in getting it off the ground. His application for the new plate was the very first application accepted.

Steve Robb is the former Executive Director of the Business and Technology Institute at Pittsburg State University. His wife, Mary Beth, received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing in 1979. While Mary Beth was in college she was in the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society. She is currently the Director of the KUMC Area Health Education Center. Steve and Mary Beth show their PSU pride by putting up flags and banners at numerous university events on campus and away. Steve has been involved in assisting with the university economic development impact study and has volunteered for many other PSU special projects over the years.
