





Today's Parents' Day game pits the nationally ranked Pittsburg State Gorillas against the Missouri Western Griffons, 3-3 in CSIC and 5-4 overall. The Gorillas are 5-1 in the conference and 6-2 overall.

Key players for the Griffons are #8 Joe Holder, conference total offense leader with 164.3 yards per game and third in the CSIC in passing with 133 yards per game.

In the backfield, the Griffons are led by #25 Dan Jacks, who is averaging 55.6 yards per game on the ground. Holder's favorite receiver is #81 Rod Northway, who is sixth in the CSIC in pass receiving with a 48.7 average.

The Gorillas are led by senior quarterback Nick Motosko who is averaging 127.1 yards in total offense and 118.2 yards per game passing. Motosko is one of 20 seniors on the 1982 Gorilla squad who are playing their last home contest.

#### **Central States Intercollegiate Conference**

The CSIC was formed in 1976-77 after the break-up of the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Ft. Hays, Pittsburg, Emporia, Washburn, and Kearney were members of the GPAC. Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the six years of its existance the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1981-82 school year several athletic teams from CSIC schools ranked among the top ten in NAIA National Competition. This included a second place national finish by the Pitt State football squad and a seventh place finish in men's outdoor track. The 1982 school year promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.






