



The Pittsburg State University Gorillas, fresh off a 10-9 upset victory over league-leading Kearney State, face the Missouri Western Griffons today at Brandenburg Stadium. It's Homecoming for PSU.

The Missouri Western Griffons improved their CSIC record to 2-3 and 2-5-1 overall with a come-from-behind 37-21 victory last Saturday over Washburn. The Griffons trailed 21-3 at halftime before scoring 27 fourth quarter points to seal the victory.

Jeff Holland, the Griffon's leading rusher with 434 yards in 107 attempts, did't play against Washburn, but he is expected to be back for this weekend.

Kevin Stephens will be Western's signal caller. He has been particularly accurate in the passing department, with 72 completions in 128 attempts for 753 yards. This had included six touchdown passes and an equal number of interceptions. His favorite receiver is Eric Hoskens who has 22 receptions for 397 yards and four TD's.

The Griffon defense is led by their linebackers Andy Felon and Stuart Standeven. Felon leads his team with 82 tackles including three quarterback sacks. Standeven is second in tackles with 61 and is the team leader in sacks with five.

Athletic Scholarship Drive



Central States Intercollegiate Conference

The CSIC was formed in 1976-77 after the break-up of the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Ft. Hays, Pittsburg, Emporia, Washburn, and Kearney were members of the GPAC. Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the eight years of its existence the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1983-84 school year several athletic teams from CSIC schools ranked among the top twenty in NAIA competition. This included a first place national finish by the Fort Hays State men's basketball squad and a fourteenth place finish by Pittsburg State in men's outdoor track. The 1984 school year promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.





The Pittsburg State coaching staff has named every member of the Gorilla defense as a "Player of the Week" after the team's 10-9 upset victory over Kearney State at Kearney Saturday night.

The Gorillas held the conference leading Antelopes to just 220 total yards, 130 yards below their 1984 per game average. Pittsburg State was particularly tough against the run, holding Kearney to 148 yards on 45 carries. The Antelopes went into the game with a 259.1 yard rushing average.

"Kearny is an excellent ground control team, but our defensive strengths are against the rush," PSU Head Coach Mike Mayerske said. "Even though Kearney was strongly favored, we knew we would have our opportunities if we could stop the run."

"The entire defensive unit had a tremendous game, and we took the scoring edge late in the game. The strength, courage and resolve of the defensive team was exceptional, and it was a credit to each one of the young men on our team," Mayerske said.

The PSU coaching staff was able to single out exceptional performances for offensive and special team "Player of the Week" honors.

Chris Grantham, 6-2, 206 lb. senior offensive guard from Grandview, Mo., received the offensive honors. Grantham, a two-time All-Conference honoree and an All-District X selection last year, made several key blocks and provided excellent protection for the PSU backfield.

The coaches named Dave Hammons "Specialty Team Player of the Week." Hammons, a 6'0", 200 lb. senior kicker from Osawatomie, Kan., made an extra point and a game-winning fieldgoal in the closing seconds of the game.

Hammons has made 14 of 16 field goals. He also punts for the Gorillas, holding a 38 yard average on 32 kicks.

The coaching staff gave another special award to Kris Kehl, junior tight end from Mound City, Kan. Kris was given "Hit of the Week" honors for his blocking.
