REPORT OF SUB-COMMITTEE ON CELEBRATION

Committee appointed by Dr. Dellinger to define scope of work and nature of committees to look after the arrangements for the celebration of President Brandenburg's 25 years of service to The State Teachers College of Pittsburg, the State of Kansas, and Education in general in the U. S.

The committee met 3 P.M. October 25th, in room 322 R.H. By concensus of opinion, the following committees were listed:

The most immediate problems would probably be committees on:

Program--which would have to do with nature of program, number and kind of events, and participants in events. This committee would probably need to be a rather broad committee drawing from students, alumni, faculty, and town people.

Time--to decide on time of events. Probably a small committee from town and faculty.

Finance--a small committee in close touch with the chairman of the general committee, whose duty it will be to consider ways and means as well as expenditures.

Publicity--perhaps a small committee to plan and a larger to work to plan.

Committees who would need to begin working soon:

Invitations--Type, To whom sent.

Committees needed later:

Memorial--collection of letters, registration of guests, binding memorial.

Honorary--taken from people of state who might be in reception lines and at honor tables.

Entertainment--housing, reception. Registration of guests

At the Last:

Committees on decoration and properties. The nature and scope of the program would determine other necessary committees.
