Dear Mr. Robison:


Your letter to this Society of May 6th, has been brought to my attention, in which you express dissatisfaction with your present classification.

Inasmuch as the new amendment to Article XIV, Section 6 of the Articles of Association is not yet in operation owing to the fact that it necessitates a great deal of time to set up this machinery among our members, I respectfully suggest that you appear before the Classification Committee at its next meeting and present your case. I will notify you of when this meeting is to be held and will be very glad to afford you an opportunity to present your case personally to the Classification Committee.

There is no record in this Society of your at any time requesting a review of your classification by the Committee. Every appeal for classification must, of necessity, come to the Classification Committee before it goes to the Board of Appeals. The Board of Appeals can only operate wherein a member dissatisfied with his classification has appealed to the Classification Committee and they have turned down his request. This was the object of the Board of Appeals.

Kindly acknowledge this communication and, if you so desire, I will be happy to notify you when the Committee meets again and you can then present your request.
