Dear Lawrence:

Had a letter from Mr. Walker yesterday and he has set the two sessions for Monday, April 28th. 10 A.M. to 1 P.M. and 2:30 P.M. to 5:30 PM.

The recording will be done at WOR in the same studio I did my last date. It is a small room and there actually is not space enough to try out the dances with a set so it looks as though we would have to give up the idea you had in mind. It would be practically impossible for me to get two couples to come from here as all the folks in our gang are working regularly - particularly the ones who know enough about it to be of any value.

Mr. Walker seems to be really enthused about the album and he also told me that my first single recording seems to be taking hold nicely and he looks for a good sale on it.

I will start on the arrangements tonight so I wish you would let me know if you intend to use "When The Works All Done This Fall" instead of "Wait For The Wagon" -

We got home at 2 AM. the other night and all in all it was an enjoyable time - little two crowded on the floor for comfort but everyone enjoyed it nevertheless.

Do you plan to go down on Sunday the 27th? Let me know and I'll arrange to meet you when ever you do. Also I'll arrange for rooms at the Abbey if you wish.
