

PSU alumnus, Ted Watts of Oswego, Kansas has literally painted his way into the forefront of American illustrations with a no-nonsense approach to his favorite subject . . . sports.

His client list includes the U.S. Olympic Committee, the National Collegiate. Athletic Association, and over 140 college and university clients from coast to coast. His works hang in the Baseball Hall of Fame, Basketball Hall of Fame, Pro Football Hall of Fame, College Football Hall of Fame, and the USA Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Watts earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from PSU in 1966. He was named an "Outstanding Young Alumnus" in 1976 as recognition for his art accomplishments. It's no wonder that Sports Illustrated's Douglas Looney said "On college campuses, Ted Watts is easily the best known sports artist in the land . . .", in his June 2, 1980 profile of the Kansan.

Those of us associated with PSU football feel very fortunate to have a friend such as Ted Watts design our annual football posters and the cover of our program. Thank you, Ted Watts.

HISTORY OF THE GORILLA


The Pittsburg State University Gorilla, one of the most unusual mascots in American higher education, was conceived in 1920 by a group of young men dissatisfied with the state of school spirit. Twenty-four students, under the leadership of Harold "Babe" Alyea, organized themselves as the "Gorillas" in order to "accelerate college spirit and enthusiasm until it shall permeate the state."

Thereafter, the Gorillas (a twenties slang term for roughnecks) sponsored pep rallies, picnics, freshman hazings, shoe "sails", special trains to athletic events, mock burials and weddings and night shirt stampedes through Pittsburg. Membership quickly grew to a hundred.

In 1923 the Gorillas had art student Helen Waskey make a drawing of the Gorilla. Two years later, they offered their symbol as its official mascot. On January 15, 1925, the student body unanimously adopted the "ferocious beast...as a name and synonym for the athletic teams."

Through the years the Gorilla's depiction became less and less ferocious and more and more loveable until 1952 when the names Gus and Gussie were given to a pair of amiable primates. During the summer of 1980, Ted Watt set about to recreate the original ferocity of the mascot. Ca Friday evening, September 5, 1980, Watts signed a limited edition of five hundred lithographs of his painting of the Pittsburg State University Gorilla, commissioned by the Alumni Association. For the first time in almost thirty years the Gorilla was once again virile and dynamic, a symbol of strength and power. PITT STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Donald Wilson President

Dr. Wilson became Pitt State's sixth President and eighth Executive Officer on December 1, 1983. His educational philosophy is based on the belief that colleges and universities should develop the entire person: mentally, physically, aesthetically and spiritually. Under his tutorledge, PSU has begun a new challenge. The "Campaign for Distinction" is a multi-million dollar fundraising drive to enhance all areas of Pittsburg State.

Before serving as President at Pitt State he served as President at Southampton College of New York and Castleton State College of Vermont. He also served as Academic Dean at Olivet College of Michigan and Dean of Applied Arts at Ontario College of Ontario, Canada. Dr. Wilson also has ten years of additional experience as an educator, administrator and coach.

Dr. Wilson earned his B.A. from Southern College of Collegedale, Tennessee, his M.A. from Andrews University of Michigan, and his Ph.D. from Michigan State University. He has traveled in 46 countries; lived in five foreign countries; has speaking or reading knowledge of six different foreign languages; and was born in Poona, India.


David Suenram Athletic Director

David Suenram became Athletic Director at PSU in 1983. He also served as the head track and cross country coach until last summer when he left his track position, to devote more time to administrative duties. Suenram received his BS degree from Pittsburg State University in 1956 and his MS from PSU in 1959. In addition, he has done graduate work at Northern Illinois and Indiana University.

Since his return in 1967, Suenram's teams have dominated District X and conference competition as well as having good showings at the national meets. The track team has won the last six conference meets and finished sixth in the nationals in 1986. The tracksters also can boast two national indoor champions in 1985. His x-country teams have not been defeated in district competition since 1980 and have won conference titles the last three years.

Dennis Franchione Head Football Coach

Dennis Franchione-Head Coach

After an 8-2 overall record, a Central States Intercollegiate Conference Championship, a trip to the NAIA national playoffs and a CSIC Coach of the year honor in his first season, what will Dennis Franchione do for an encore?


Franchione took a team laden with young players and guided them to Pittsburg State's fourth CSIC title and its first since 1981. But then, titles are nothing new for Franchione.

The native of Cherokee, Kansas, took Southwestern College to the KCAC title in 1982 with a 9-2 record. For his efforts, Franchione was named KCAC and NAIA District 10 Coach of the Year, and his two-year record at Southwestern was 14-4-2.

He then accepted a position with Tennessee Tech University as its offensive coordinator for two seasons prior to becoming the Gorilla mentor.

His other college coaching experience includes a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Kansas State University from 1978 to 1981. Franchione was receiver coach and was an administrative assistant in charge of Kansas and Kansas City area recruiting.

His high school coaching experience includes two years at Peabody (KS) High School, 1976-77; Mulvane (KS) High School, 1975 and Miller (MO) High School, 1973-74.

Bill Samuels Offensive Line

Coach Samuels is a 1958 and 1964 graduate of Pittsburg State. He returned to Pitt State in 1967 after a three year coaching stint at Riverton (Kansas) High School. His many notable performances during the 1957 NAIA football championship won acclaim for both himself and the University. Coach Samuels will coach the offensive linemen this season as well as help coach Franchione with the implementation of the offensive philosophy. Through Samuels' career at Pitt State his coaching responsibilities have included: the defensive secondary, receivers, offensive backs and specialty teams.

Jon Stammers Wide Receivers

Jon Stammers enters his second year at PSU, again coaching receivers. Stammers began his coaching career in 1981 at Mercy High School in St. Louis. His 1982-83 seasons were spent in St. James and his 1985 year at Monett, both in Missouri. Stammers was a PSU Graduate Assistant in 1984.

A 1980 Benedictine College grad, coach Stammers received an MA from PSU in 1985 and received a Strength and Conditioning Specialist Degree this summer.

Stammers, a St. James, Missouri native, is single.





Mike Cawthon Assistant Line

Mike begins his second season at Pitt State, again assisting Coach Samuels on the Offensive line.


Coach Cawthon was a lineman at Northwest Missouri State and graduated from there in 1985. Cawthon is presently working on his Master's Degree at Pitt State.

Craig Benson Running Backs

Benson starts his first season at PSU assisting Coach Franchione with the offensive backs. Benson was a standout quarterback at Panhandle State University in Oklahoma.

Benson ran the Veer and helped the Aggies to a national-ranking and a Sunflower Bowl victory.

Benson and his wife, Lesha, have a two year-old son, Brandon.





Lynn Meredith Secondary

Meredith comes to Pittsburg State from Highland Park High School in Topeka, Kansas, where he was head coach last season.

The native on Manhattan, Kansas, had served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Panhandle State University for three seasons prior to being named coach at Highland Park.

While at Panhandle State, Meredith's defenses were rated in the top five in the NAIA three times.

He was head coach at Washington (KS) High School during the 1981 season and had served as a graduate and part-time assistant coach at Kansas State with Dennis Franchione. Meredith helped the varsity and junior varsity teams and coordinated KSU recruiting in Manhattan.

Jerry Kill Linebackers

Jerry Kill enters his second year at Pitt State again coaching linebackers and as Defensive Coordinator.

A former linebacker at Southwestern under Coach Franchione, Kill graduated in 1982. After spending 1983 as a graduate assistant at SC, Jerry coached defense at Midwest High School in Oklahoma City.

Coach Kill, a Cheney, Kansas native, is married to the former Rebecca Smith of Liberal.





Anton Stewart Defensive Line

Coach Stewart begins his second year at Pittsburg State coaching the Defensive line. Anton was an All-American offensive lineman at Southwestern College during Coach Franchione's tenure.

Anton, a Bristol, Virginia native, is single and will earn his degree this year.

Manny Acosta Outside Linebackers

Manny Acosta, a two-time All-American Defensive End, will start his college coaching career this season. Acosta played at Panhandle State and was team captain of their nationally ranked defenses.

Coach Acosta, a Douglas, Arizona native, graduated in May, 1986.





Al Ortolani Head Trainer

Al Ortolani has been a permanent fixture at PSU since his days as a student starting in 1948. Al graduated in 1954 and became PSU's trainer in 1955. Sprinkled in his years as Head Trainer, was a Head Baseball coaching stint from 1962-1966.

Al is well-known in the U.S. for his expertise with athletic injury rehabilitation and has been involved with many swim teams on the National and International levels.

Dr. David Kendall Academic Counselor

Pittsburg State University Athletic teams are very fortunate to enlist the services of Dr. Kendall. Very few schools the size of Pitt State have a full-time academic advisor. Dr. Kendall provides study hall assignments, tutoring service, grade monitoring, and scheduling services to all PSU athletes. Dr. Kendall's office is located in the Weede building directly adjacent to all athletic coaches' offices and is always available to athletes.





John Johnson Strength Coach

The football Gorillas are very fortunate to employ the services of J.J. as their strength coach. Coach Johnson brings vast knowledge, practical experience, dedication, and enthusiasm to the quest for bigger, faster, and stronger athletes. Tonight the Gorillas are kicking off the start of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference (CSIC) schedule against the Emporia State University Hornets. Both teams come into tonight's game with undefeated records.

The Gorillas improved their record to 2-0 as they defeated the University of Missouri-Rolla Miners, 37 to 14, in Rolla on Sept. 20. Gene Stegeman led the Gorillas with 159 yards rushing, while Monte Weathers had another explosive game with three touchdowns. Meanwhile the Gorillas' defensive was hard at work with three interceptions.

Emporia State defeated Baker University 35 to 7 to improve their record to 3-0. David Tryon scored two touchdowns for the Hornets and finished the game with 160 rushing yards to become the all-time rushing leader at Emporia State with 2,799 career yards.

The Gorillas lead the series 36-28-2, although the Hornets defeated Pittsburg State, 41 to 9, last year to snap an 11-game winning streak the Gorillas held against Emporia.

Tonight's game will also be a national game as both teams entered the week in the national rankings. In the Sept. 17 NAIA Division I top twenty poll, the Gorillas were ranked in the fourth place position, while Emporia entered the top twenty at 19.

Pittsburg State University would like to extend a special welcome to the residents of Girard, Kan. They are the Gorillas' special guests in a new regional outreach program sponsored by the University.

The Gorillas will be on the road for the next two weekends at Missouri Southern State College and Washburn University before returning home for the Oct. 18 homecoming game against Fort Hays State University.


