A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

". . . The fact is I don't know what'll become of us. Here it is the middle of August and the coldest day of the year. It's simply freezing: the dogs are sticking to the sidewalks; can anyone explain that? No. But I'm not surprised. The whole world's at sixes and sevens, and why the house hasn't fallen down about our ears long ago is a miracle to me. night this same anxiety as to whether the master will get home safely: whether he'll bring home anything to eat. In the midst of life we are in the midst of death, a truer word was never said. . . . We've rattled along, hot and cold, for some time now, and my advice to you is not to inquire into why or whither, but just enjoy your ice cream while it's on your plate; that's my philosophy. Don't forget that a few years ago we came through the depression by the skin of our teeth! One more tight squeeze like that and where will we be?. . . " Thornton Wilder, The Skin Of Our Teeth, 1942

The immortal words of Sabina, the overworked maid in Wilder's classic, have a special meaning today. The world IS at sixes and sevens -- in Yugoslavia, Somalia, the former Soviet Union AND United States! Daily we discuss "ethnic cleansing," allbeit we call it "family values," or the "Moral Majority" or the "AIDS Catastrophe." Still and all, this is ETHNIC CLEANSING! Nightly, we watch Los Angeles, New York and Anytown disintigrate before our very eyes. "Carjacking" in Washington suburbs with infants tossed out of car windows and housewives dragged to their death entangled in seat belts, Supreme Court nominees in harassment trials, unemployment, unstable currency, drug busts on Interstates and failing banking institutions. Wait a minute!

As a youth, when I recall the horrors that were World War II: bombed-out cities, mutilated corpses in concentration camps--the one phrase that I remember most was--"NEVER AGAIN!" Is a "kinder and gentler" America mere fiction?

Cabaret is a warning! Certainly it may also be an evening of entertainment. But, let the real message ring true: "One more tight squeeze like that and where will we be?". Ice cream will not be served in the lobby at intermission.

Returning to PSU in the fall of 1977 as a graduate student, Mr. Green performed with the PSU Faculty String Quartet and as solist with the PSU Symphony Orchestra. The next years were spent as staff pianist with the UMKC Dance Division and the Kansas City Ballet, and as vocal instructor at the Lindenwood Colleges in the St. Louis For the last 13 years, Mr. Green has made New York City his home, working and performing in a diversity of styles. He has performed in theatre and opera companies throughout NYC and the Northeast area, and his realization of John Gay's "The Beggar's Opera" was performed in NYC to public acclaim. As a recital accompanist, he has performed at Carnegie Recital Hall and the Juilliard School of Music. Most recently his musical revue of Rodger's and Hammerstein's music, "If I Love You", was performed in Sunriver, Oregon.
