Biographical Note	Robert Fowler, born December 24, 1829, in Lincolnshire, England. The Fowler family came to the United States from England in 1835, originally settling in Sangamon County, New York. Robert Fowler (born in 1829) married Minerva Bilyeau, (born February 9, 1828). They both lived until 1903. In 1857 Robert and Minerva Fowler came to Kansas from Texas where they had relocated. They settled on a homestead in what would later become Crawford County. Robert established a trading business and later served during the Civil War. Robert and Minerva had twelve children. Eleven survived to adulthood, including Elizabeth, Lois, George, Tom, Pete, Millie, Jennie, Fannie, Robert, Victoria and William.

Thelma Fowler Renfro is the granddaughter of Robert Fowler's son, George. Several of the Fowlers in this line worked in the banking business, including James Thomas "J. T." Fowler, the son of George Fowler and father of Thelma Fowler, who helped establish the Home State Bank in Arcadia, Kansas in 1908.

Thelma May Fowler Renfro was born December 22, 1901 and died August 31, 1992. She married Raymond Reid Renfro (1901-1985) in 1946. She attended the Pittsburg State student from 1920-1928. She received a degree in speech, art, and English. She was assistant editor of the Collegio from 1922-1924 and the only girl on the debate team. Thelma was also a member of the Kappa Delta Pi sorority.
