This delightful off-Broadway hit (winner of the 1986 Outer Critics Circle award, Best Off-Broadway Musical), is about the efforts of the Order of the Little Sisters of Hoboken (a nunnery) to raise money to bury the remaining four of the 52 nuns who have died of botulism contracted by eating vichyssoise prepared by the convert chef, Sister Julia (Child of God). Our five nuns have been spared the fate of the other sisters as they were playing bingo that night at another parish. *Nunsense* is the fundraising show they are presenting to us in hopes we will help them with the necessary cash.

Acclaimed on Broadway and in its ninth award-winning year in London's West End, this rags-to-riches story makes a haunting musical tragedy of our times.

Mrs. Johnstone, deserted by her husband and with a houseful of kids to feed, learns she is expecting twins, whom she cannot possibly afford to keep. She cleans house for childless Mrs. Lyons who, learning of her plight, begs one of her twins from her at birth. The two boys grow up streets apart, never learning the truth but becoming firm friends (and in love with the

same girl) despite their differing backgrounds and the attempts of Mrs. Lyons to keep them apart. Mickey Johnstone loses his job, marries the girl, turns to crime and becomes dependent on tranquilizers. Edward Lyons prospers, goes to university and becomes Senator. But a Narrator, intruding like fate, warns that a "price has to be paid." The price is the life of the blood brothers who die in tragic circumstances - fulfilling the prophecy that twins parted at birth will die on the day they find out their heritage.


