Dear Mr. Robison:

It is my understanding that M.G.M. Records has informed you briefly of the intents and purposes of the Greater Hartford Record Festival and your appearance there.

Nevertheless, I should like to explain that the week-long series of events and concerts are being put on by the entire phonograph record industry. Co-sponsoring the events are the Hartford Times and the Hartford Courant. Both newspapers will receive the proceeds of the events for their respective summer camps for underprivileged children.

You are to appear on the program of Wednesday night, October 1 at the Bushnell Memorial Hall in Hartford, Conn. The rest of the bill is the Walt Jaworski polka band, Neil Burris and the Pee Wee King band. I've spoken to King and he will be only too happy to supply any accompaniment you may need. His, I believe you know, is a typical country and western band of 11 men.


If you could notify me or Dr. Warren Freeman at this office or at the Bushnell Memorial Hall as to the number or numbers you want to do and how you want to be accompanied, I am sure we will be able to meet with your wishes.

Would you also please tell us how you want to be transported to Hartford? Will you come from Pleasant Valley or from New York? Shall we provide transportation or hotel rooms?

If you could be in Hartford early on Wednesday, we could arrange for press and radio interviews. If not, then we will see to it that you are properly programmed and presented at the concert.
