Biographical Note Charles Reitz was born in Buffalo, New York in 1946. He attended Canisius College in Buffalo, New York from 1964 to 1968. After receiving a bachelor's degree he attended the University of Freiburg [Germany] from 1969 to 1971, receiving a graduate degree. He earned his Doctorate in Educational Philosophy from the University of Buffalo in 1983. Dr. Reitz regularly contributes to the ongoing discussion and development of critical social theory and critical pedagogy. Reitz retired in 2006 as Professor of Philosophy and Social Science at Kansas City Kansas Community College, where he also served as Director of Multicultural Education and President of the Faculty Association (KNEA).
