Re: Extension of Agreements for Period Expiring December 31, 1965

More than a year has elapsed since we sent you your Extension Agreements for the period expiring December 31, 1965.

On November 30, 1943 we advised you that such Extension Agreements had been received from writers and publishers representing more than 80 per cent of the Society's distribution of domestic royalties, and that therefore such Extension Agreements had become effective.

You are one of the few members who have not sent in their Extension Agreements.

We are about to submit to our Board a list of those who have not signed their Extensions. Before doing so, however, we want to be sure that your failure to sign has been due only to a mere oversight.

Accordingly there are enclosed herewith duplicate copies of your Extension Agreements.

Will you please sign and return the same at once so that we may remove your name from the list of those who have not yet renewed.

Gentlemen:

With respect to the agreement entered into between you and the undersigned, dated the 27th day of December, 1935, as extended by agreement dated the 12thday of September, 1938, you and the undersigned hereby agree to further extend the same and all the terms, conditions and provisions thereof for all purposes for a further period of fifteen (15) years, so that the same shall expire on the 31st day of December, 1965, instead of on the 31st day of December, 1950.

Your signature and seal at the foot hereof, underneath the word "ACCEPTED", together with the signature of the undersigned at the foot hereof, will make this a valid, binding and enforceable agreement between us.
