Biographical Note	Mamie Eugenia Egbert is a 1952 Pittsburg State University alumna. Her husband, Donald, graduated from a community college in Garden City, Kansas in 1951. He was a template maker in Wichita, Kansas when he enlisted in the US Air Force. He served through 1957 assigned to the 30 th Tactical Reconnaissance Squadron. He served in Germany where he helped to form Legion Post #1 in Kaiserslautern. He finished active duty in 1955 and was Honorably Discharged in 1957. He received the National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, and the Army Occupation Medal while in service.
