DANIEL PERANTONI

Throughout the brass world and particularly among tubists, Daniel Perantoni has achieved an enviable reputation as both performer and teacher. He is responsible for many important new compositions for tuba. He is in demand as a tuba soloist and brass clinician at national music conferences and on campuses throughout the United States. Mr. Perantoni is a contributing author to several music education publications. His popularity and leadership abilities led to his election as National President (June 1973-76) of T.U.B.A. (Tubists Universal Brotherhood Association).

Daniel Perantoni was born in 1941 in Johnsonburg, Pennsylvania. He is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music (B.M. 1963) and the Catholic University of America (M.M. 1968). While at Eastman he was a member of the renowned Eastman Wind Ensemble directed by Frederick Fennell, and a member of the Eastman Philharmonic Orchestra which in 1962 toured Europe, Russia, and the Near East. His education also included private study with Donald Knaub, Harvey Phillips, and Arnold Jacobs.

Daniel Perantoni's professional career includes the San Antonio Symphony (1963-64), United States Army Band (1964-66), and the Amsterdam Philharmonic Orkest (1966-67). During his tenure in Amsterdam he also performed with the Netherlands Ballet Society and the Rotterdam Philharmonic. He has performed with both the National Symphony and the St. Louis Symphony. In 1968 Mr. Perantoni was appointed to the faculty of the University of Illinois School of Music. He is a member of the Illinois Faculty Brass Quintet and the Champaign-Urbana Symphony. He is also active with the Mid-West Tuba Trio, other members being J. Leslie Varner (Ball State University) and Harvey Phillips (Indiana University). Daniel Perantoni may be heard on recordings of solos for tuba on the University Brass Recording Series available from the University of Illinois.
