DR. JACK STAMP is Conductor of Bands at IUP where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, Symphony Band and teaches courses in conducting and percussion. Dr. Stamp received his B. S. in Music Education degree from IUP, a Master's in Percussion Performance from East Carolin University, and a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Conducting from Michigan State University. Prior to his appointment at IUP, he served as chairman of the Division of Fine Arts at Campbell University in North Carolina. He also taught for several years in the public schools of North Carolina. In addition to these posts, Dr. Stamp has taught at Duke University and served as conductor and musical director for the award-winning Triangle British Brass Band.

An active composer for band, Dr. Stamp has over ten original works for band, five which are published. His composition teacers have included Robert Washburn and Fisher Tull.

Dr. Stamp is also an active performing percussionist having numerous solo performances on campus as well as appearances with the North Carolina Symphony, Johnstown Symphony, and Westmoreland Symphony.

He is in demand nationally as a guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and composer.



KEVIN SEDATOLE joined the faculty of Stephen F. Austin State University in the Fall of 1991. His duties as associate director of bands include directing the Lumberjack Marching Band and conducting the Symphonic Band. Before coming to Stephen F. Austin, Mr. Sedatole taught in the Klein and Austin Independent School Districts receiving top honors at U.I.L. contests and state festivals. Mr. Sedatole is currently finishing the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Texas at Austin. Mr. Sedatole most recently had the honor of conducting the University of Texas Wind Ensemble at the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in Manchester, England this past summer. A native of Texas, Mr. Sedatole holds degrees from Baylor University and the University of Texas at Austin. Mr. Sedatole is a member of the College Band Director's National Association, the Texas Music Educator's Association, Texas Bandmaster Association, and is affiliated with Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.
