In the summer of 2002 he added Interim Chair to his list of duties. His teaching responsibilities include directing the "Pride of the Plains" Marching Band, conducting both the Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band, and teaching conducting, as well as other courses in the music education sequence. Dr. Fuchs holds degrees in music education from Missouri Western State College and the University of Missouri-Columbia, and a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Wind Conducting from the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music where his primary conducting mentor was Gary Hill. Fuchs has additional instruction through workshops with Jack Stamp, H. Robert Reynolds, and Anthony Miello. Dr. Fuchs has ten years of teaching experience in the public schools of Kansas and Missouri, most recently as Director of Bands at Shawnee Mission West High School in Overland Park, Kansas.

Since his arrival at Pittsburg State, the band program has seen tremendous growth and improvement. The program currently enrolls approximately 110 students from various academic areas and the improved quality in all aspects of the program is widely recognized in the region.

Dr. Fuchs is active as a clinician, adjudicator and drill writer throughout the Midwest. He has also served on international adjudication panels in both Paris, France and Maastricht, The Netherlands. Fuchs was a member of the trumpet section in the T.D. Pack Band, the official band of the Kansas City Chiefs, from 1989 until 2002. Dr. Fuchs holds memberships in MENC, KMEA, KBA, CBDNA, Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and is a member of the Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honor Society.

**Dr. James Ackman** was appointed Assistant Director of Bands and Director of Percussion Studies at Pittsburg State University in July 2002. His teaching responsibilities include serving as Instructor for the Drumline of the "Pride of the Plains" Marching Band, conducting the Symphonic Band and the Pep Band, teaching Jazz Appreciation, and Studio Percussion. Dr. Ackman holds a Bachelors Degree in Music/Music Education from Southern Illinois University, a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting from Eastern Illinois University, and a Ph.D. in Music Education from the University of Florida. His mentors in Music Education include Dr. Charles Hoffer, and Dr. Richard Colwell.

Dr. Ackman has thirteen years of teaching experience in the public schools of Illinois and Massachusetts. His university teaching experience includes positions at Boston University, Texas A&M University-Kingsville, and the University of Rhode Island. He has several published articles and presented at the MENC National Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. Ackman holds memberships in MENC, CMS, PAS, NECBA, Kappa Kappa Psi, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He serves as Principal Percussionist for the Southeastern Kansas Symphony Orchestra, and is active as both a performer and teacher of percussion.
