Biographical Sketch

Lawrence L. Bowyer graduated from Pittsburg State Teachers College (now Pittsburg State University) in 1942 with a degree in business education. Following his graduation, Bowyer joined the US Marine Corps, enlisting as a Captain after Pearl Harbour. Bowyer served as a Captain in the Pacific theater during World War II. After his time in the service Bowyer worked teaching business classes at Pittsburg High School for 39 years.

Lawrence married Jo Helen Myers Bowyer on May 17, 1943, and they remained married until his death. Jo Helen Myers Bowyer was a stenographer at Emporia State Teachers College and Neosho County Welfare Office. After being married Jo Helen was a homemaker, and enjoyed activities like sowing, knitting, crocheting, fishing, and camping. Jo Helen was a member of the First United Methodist Church, UMW, AARP, and the Southwest Kansas retired school personnel. She died on May 29, 2020.

This collection contains a single item: a Smith-Corona Sterling portable typewriter. The typewriter was purchased by Lawrence L. Bowyer in 1949, at Etteringer Office Supply in Pittsburg, Kansas.
