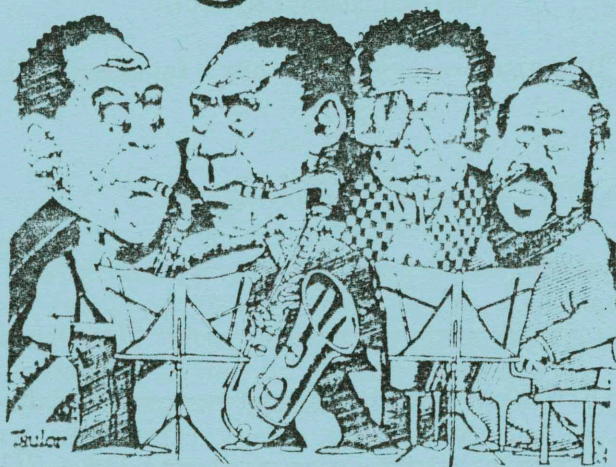

### ROBERT KEHLE

Mr. Robert Kehle joined the faculty at Pittsburg State University in 1978. He has a Bachelor of Music and a Bachelor of Arts from Washington State University and a Master of Music degree from Indiana University, where he studied trombone with Dr. S. Thomas Beversdorf, Mr. Keith Brown and Mr. M. Dee Stewart. His jazz teachers include Mr. David Baker and Mr. Dominic Spera. Mr. Kehle played with the Spokane Jazz Society, back-up for touring artists such as Bob Hope and Wayne Newton, and recording work in the Indianapolis area. Besides his jazz and commercial experience he played trombone with the Spokane Symphony and is currently principal trombone with the Springfield, MO, Symphony Orchestra and the Central Plains Brass Quintet. He is President-Elect of the Kansas National Association of Jazz Educators.

As an Assistant Professor of Music, Mr. Kehle's responsibilities include teaching low brass and Jazz Studies.
