Charles Yingling

Charles Yingling earned a Bachelor of Music degree from Southwestern College, Winfield, KS in 1967. He is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree from Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, NM.

Mr. Yingling taught 9 years in the Hugoton, KS school system as instrumental music director for grades seven through twelve. While in Hugoton, he founded and directed the Gas Capital Community Band. He was also a trumpet player with the Prairie Brass. For the past eight years he has directed the Kansas State FFA Band. Mr. Yingling is currently a member of the Kansas Music Educators Association, Music Educators National Conference, Kansas Bandmasters Association and the International Trumpet Guild. Currently he is the instrumental music teacher for Winfield High School and Southwestern College.

Robert Kehle

Mr. Kehle joined the Pittsburg State University faculty in 1978. He holds the rank of associate professor of music and teaches Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba and is the Director of the PSU Jazz Studies program. Bob holds both the B. M. degree and the B. A. (Music Education) degree from Washington State University and a M. M. in Trombone degree from Indiana University where he has completed his doctoral course work. His trombone teachers include Dr. S. Thomas Beversdorf, Mr. Keith Brown, Mr. M. Dee Stewart and Mr. Edward Kleinhammer. He has performed with the Spokane Symphony, the Indiana Brass Quintet, Slide Hampton's World of Trombones, the Spokane Jazz Society, Mr. Louis Bellson and has been a featured soloist with the Music Festival of Arkansas, the Springfield and the Southeast Kansas Symphonies. Mr. Kehle is also Principal Trombone in the Springfield, MO Symphony Orchestra, is trombonist with the jazz group Blues Over Easy, the PSU Brass Quintet, the Central Plains Brass Quintet and is on the faculty of the Music Festival of Arkansas. Mr. Kehle is a former President of the Kansas Unity of the International Association of Jazz Educators. He also is the host of "The Brass Odyssey" a special radio show featuring brass music.

James Tapia

Mr. Tapia joined the PSU faculty in 1990 as director of bands. He also teaches trumpet. He received his bachelor of music degree in trumpet performance from the University of South Florida in Tampa, FL, and completed his master of music degree in instrumental conducting at the University of Texas at Austin, where he is presently a candidate for the doctor of music degree in instrumental conducting. James has been a trumpet performer in many diverse areas including: principal trumpet in the Fort Myers Symphony Orchestra, trumpet staff at Disney World as well as performing with the Florida Orchestra, the Tampa Bay Performing Arts Center Orchestra and the Sarasota Opera Orchestra. He currently performs with the Central Plains Brass Quintet and Pittsburg State University Brass Quintet as well as the Springfield Symphony Orchestra. He conducts the Pittsburg State University "Pride of the Plains" marching and Pep Bands, the PSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble and the PSU Chamber Winds.
