Airman First Class Tim Anderson, French Horn, is from Stanhope, Iowa. Tim was selected three times for the Iowa All-State Band. He attended Iowa State University for a short time where he studied with Daniel Phillips, a former student of Phillip Farkas. Tim has played principal horn with the SAC Band after joining the Air force two years ago, and was a finalist in the horn audition for the U. S. Air Force Band in Washington D. C.

Airman First Class Warren Endersbe, trumpet, is a 1984 graduate with a degree in trumpet performance from the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks. While in Grand Forks he played principal trumpet in the Grand Forks Symphony. Former teachers include Manny Laureano, Principal trumpet of the Minnesota Orchestra, and Gary Bordner, principal trumpet with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra. In 1982 he was chosen on a national audition to study with Susan Slaughter, principal trumpet of the St. Louis Symphony for Trumpet Lab '82. Endersbe has been the featured soloist in 10 countries throughout Europe with the International Ambassadors of Music as well as in much of the U.S. with the SAC Band, stationed at Offutt AFB in Omaha, NE. He has also had the opportunity to perform with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra and the Omaha Symphony. He was the national winner in the Orchestral Winds division of the National Federation of Music Clubs competition and while playing lead trumpet for the Continental Brass in 1981, he won the Christian Artists national talent competition.

Airman First Class Douglas A. Roe, trombone, is from Littleton, Colorado. In high school he was twice selected to both the Centennial League Honor Band and the Colorado All-State Band. He attended West Texas State University in Canyon, Texas, receiving a Bachelor of Music degree in Euphonium and a secondary music education certificate. While there, he studied with the late Donald Baird, a former euphonium soloist with the U.S. Army Band in Washington, D.C. Doug was also a graduate assistant in music theory at the University of Northern Iowa, Cedar Falls. His performance credits include two summers on euphonium at the National Music Camp, Interlochen, Michigan, second trombone for three years with the Southeast Iowa Symphony Orchestra, and bass trumpet with the Amarillo (Texas) Symphony Orchestra. Roe joined the SAC Band in April 1985. Doug is married to the former Karen Hovland of Littleton, Colorado, and they have one son.

Staff Sergeant John Thomason, tuba, graduated from Plattsmouth (NE) High School in 1976 after winning the John Philip Sousa Band Award. He attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln where he played in the Marching Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, Brass Ensemble, Orchestra, and Low Brass Ensemble. He performed the Vaughan Williams "Concerto for Bass Tuba" with the University Orchestra and has also played with the Lincoln Symphony Orchestra.

Airman First Class Steven Wagle, trumpet, is a 1984 graduate of Clarion University of Pennsylvania. During his senior year, Steven was a featured soloist during the CUP concert band's tour of Mexico. Steven's teachers have included Stan Mark, formerly of the Maynard Ferguson Orchestra and Dr. Joe Christianson of Iowa State University. Steven joined the SAC Brass following the completion of his studies at Clarion in 1984.
