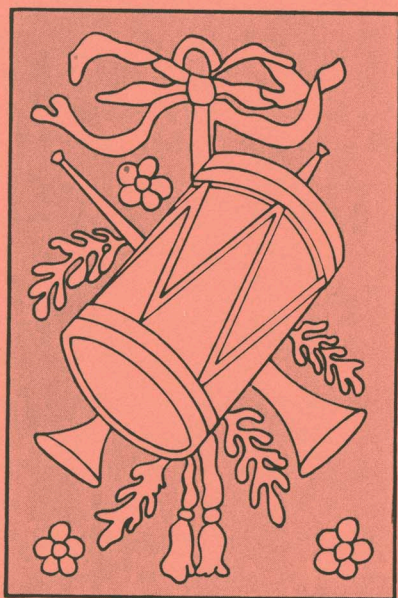


**Music Preparatory

Pittsburg State University's **Music Preparatory Division** is aimed toward offering quality instruction for music students with any level of background, including older, non-traditional students. Instruction is provided by adjunct faculty, graduate assistants, and selected advanced students in the university's Department of Music.

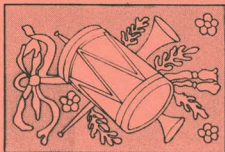
Students are enrolled in a non-credit course through the university, and the semester runs concurrently with the university semester. The **Music Preparatory Division** is organized into junior and senior divisions: junior division (through grade 8), for the instructional fee of \$100; and senior division (grade 9 and above), for the instructional fee of \$120. The semester of fifteen private lessons concludes with a formal certificate of completion, with additional recognition for outstanding students. In addition, all students receive free tickets to the concert in the Department of Music's prestigious Solo and Chamber Music Series which represents their particular area of study.

Enrollment and payment of fees for the Fall '95 semester will be held on August 21 and 22. Parents and/or students should come to the Music Office in McCray Hall between 10:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. (or by appointment) to fill out applied lesson requests. 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For those looking for a great way to start a young student along the road toward the fulfillment that comes from mastering a stringed instrument, Pittsburgh State University's **Suzuki String Program** is a proven choice. Dr. Suzuki's world-renowned method exemplifies his philosophy that students make the best progress when they are "nurtured by love," and the success of this principle has become legendary. One of the greatest strengths of this method is the way an adult important in the child's life (usually a parent or guardian) makes a commitment to share in and support the child's musical experience.

In Pittsburgh State University's **Suzuki String Program**, each child receives one individual lesson per week and also participates as a group member of a class with the other Suzuki students. As in the **Music Preparatory Division**, students are enrolled in a non-credit course through the university, and the semester runs concurrently with the university semester. Fees per semester are \$170, and financial aid is available for those who qualify.
