Brendan Townsend Conductor

Born in Cork, Ireland, Brendan Townsend began music lessons with his father at age three. He enrolled as a student at the Cork School of Music studying cello, chamber music, orchestra, choir and theory. He graduated with an education degree in 1988 before moving to the Netherlands to study for his masters in Cello Pedagogy and Orchestral Conducting.

Brendan Townsend made his conducting debut at age 18 conducting Gilbert & Sullivan's "Mikado." He went on to conduct orchestras, choirs and operatic ensembles in Ireland, the Netherlands and throughout Europe. He was the associate conductor at the Netherlands Promenade Orchestra and Music Director of the professional chamber orchestras "Ars Antiqua et Nova" and "Sinfonietta Geleen." In 1997 he moved to the United States to become Music director of the Youth Orchestras of San Antonio. He was recently appointed Director of Orchestras at the University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio, TX.

Mr. Townsend is committed to music education and the development of young people. As a regular guest conductor in high schools around Texas, Mr. Townsend has developed a reputation as an energetic, humorous and inspiring conductor who brings out the best in young people.
