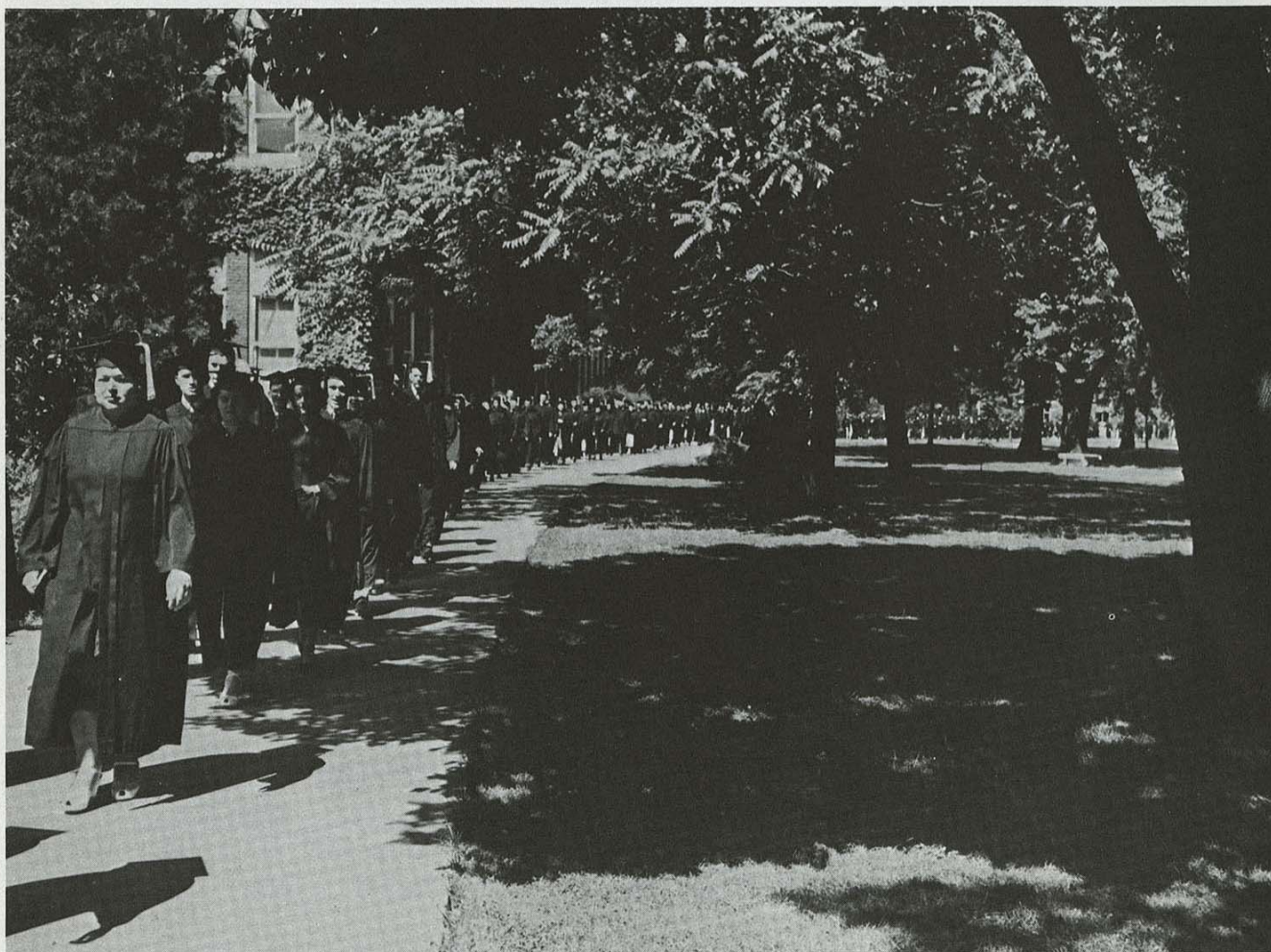




History can be found in text books, personal diaries and yearbooks. The history of Kansas State College is well-known. Founded in 1903 as the Auxiliary Manual Training Normal School, this college is the youngest of the five state institutions of higher learning in Kansas.

Though young in comparison with many other colleges and universities, Kansas State College has an eventful past to reflect upon. "It's history is filled with evidences of worthy objectives, strong personalities, growing standards, splendid educational services, genuine interest and loyalty of the citizens of the community and of the state."

In 1960 Kansas State College will see its 60th year of existence. It has progressed from the Auxiliary Manual Training School to Kansas State Teachers College to Kansas State College. When written,



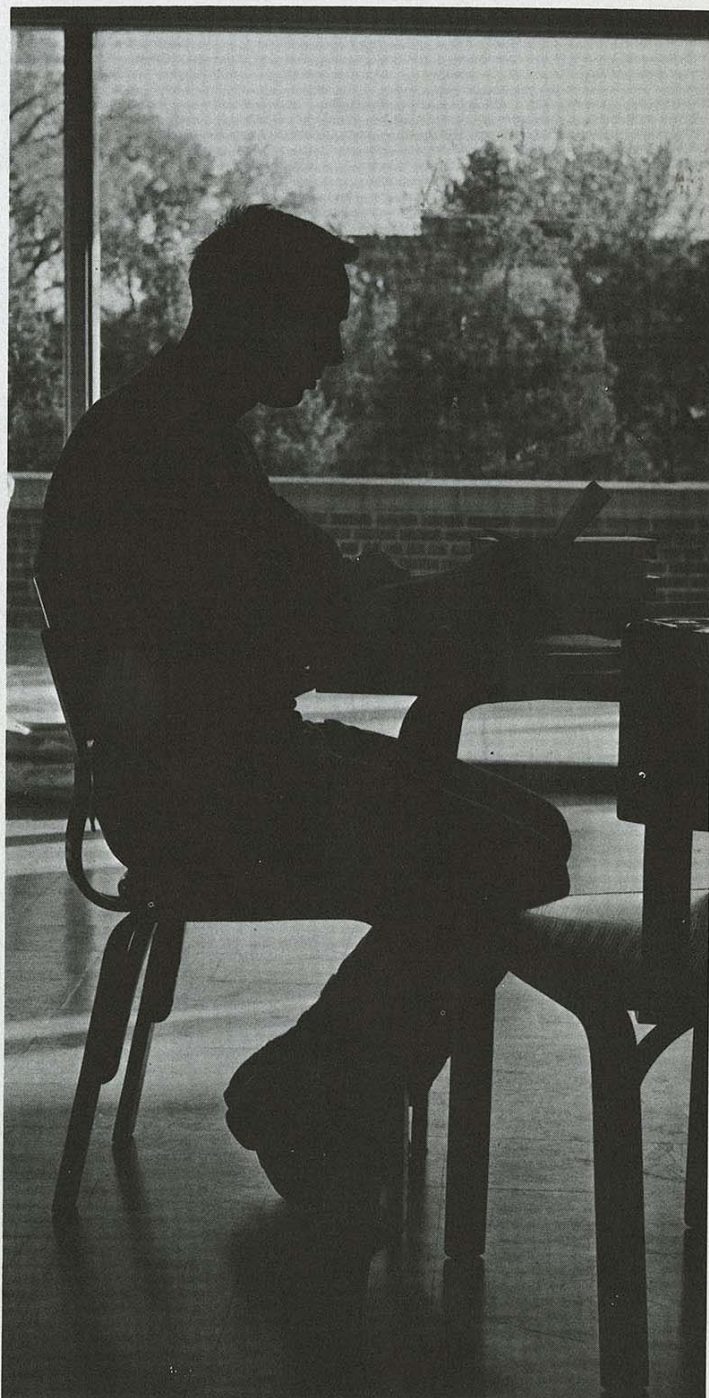


this succession of events looks relatively simple, but there was a long and bitter struggle before the existence of this college was acknowledged. And this conflict did not end with the founding of the school. There has been a series of struggles by the patrons of the College to enhance its growth.

After the struggle to establish the college in Pittsburg, there was the fight for independence from the Emporia school, followed by the battle to obtain the right to give its graduates the life certificate to teach and the baccalaureate degree. Then again there were the efforts to achieve the right to offer graduate courses leading to the Master's degree. Today, the College offers a six-year Specialist in Education degree.

R. S. Russ was the originator of the idea of a school at Pittsburg. He led the college through many of its most important battles and put this institution on the path that has led it to its present position.

An organization without traditions is not a complete organization. There are many traditions on our campus. One of the best-known is that of "Apple Day" or "Commemoration Day" which is celebrated annually in the early spring. History has it that in 1907 when the struggle for an appropriation for a new building was successfully concluded, the appropriation bill was pushed through the legislature by the late Senator E. F. Porter with the aid of Mr.



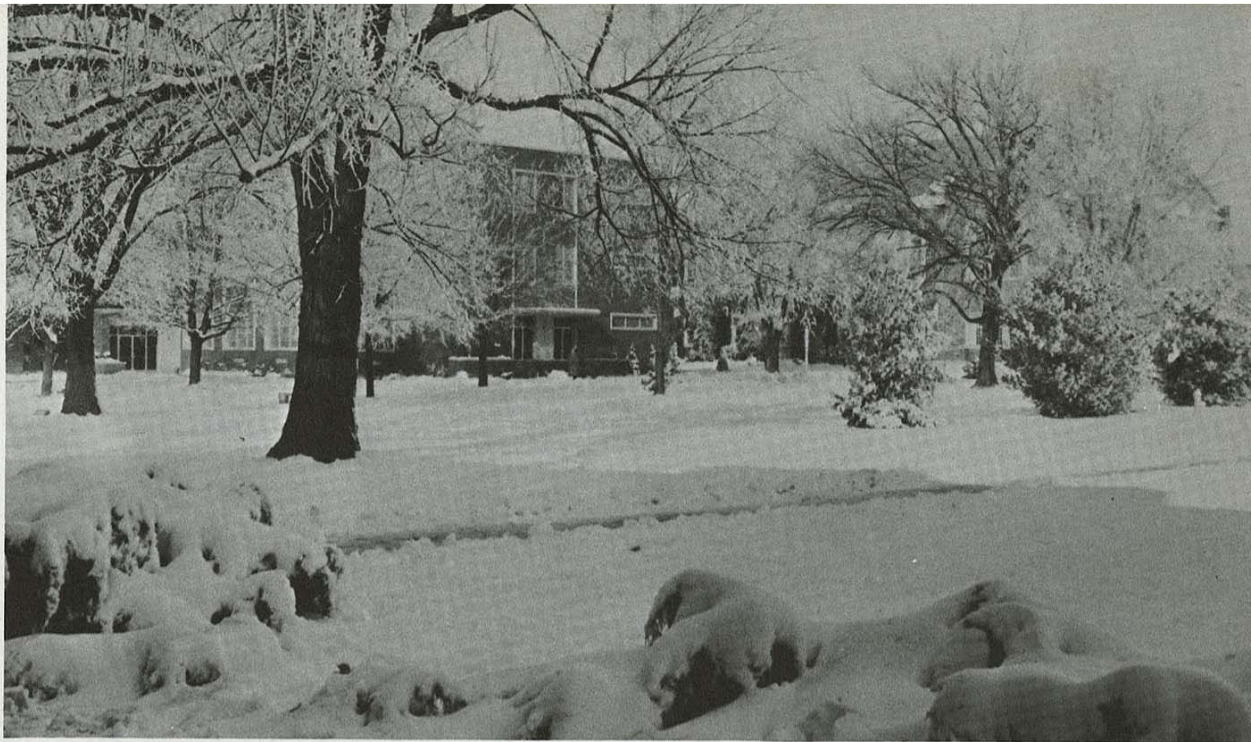


Russ. When the bill was finally passed, the legislature voted to fine Senator Porter, Mr. Russ and their associates a barrel of apples for the "successful lobbying". On his return to Pittsburg, Mr. Russ told a few of the students that if at the proper time in the assembly the motion was made to fine the faculty a barrel of apples, he would let the students vote on it. The first Apple Day was March 8, 1905. Though this story may not exactly fit the true facts, the tradition was established and has been passed to successive generations of Pittsburg students.

During the administration of Dr. George E. Myers, second principal of the State Manual Training Normal School, there was a renewed demand for separation from the Emporia school. Students took an active part

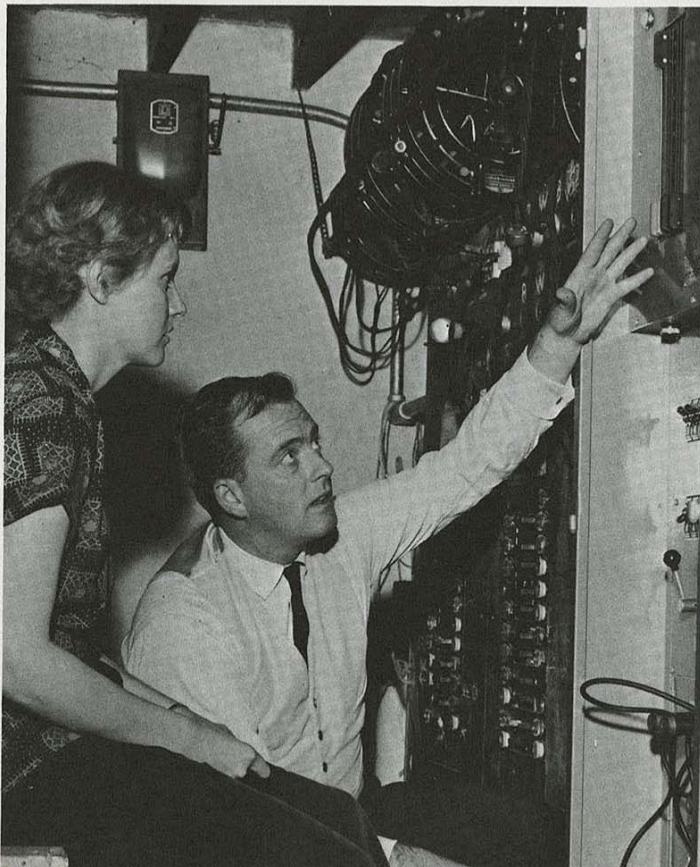






in the campaign. A typewriter room was made available in Russ hall for the students. During their free hours the students worked in this room sending out hundreds of letters to key persons in all parts of the state concerning the separation. Modern day repetition of this procedure was observed in the spring of 1959 when Kansas State students again supported in word and deed the proposal of a change in the name of the college to fit its present liberal arts status.

For the next 27 years, from 1913 to 1940, William A. Brandenburg served as the chief officer and first president of the Manual Training School. "Before the close of President Brandenburg's first year, disaster struck,



and threatened the very existence of the school." On June 29, 1944, Russ hall was struck by lightning and burned. "Undoubtedly the damage to Russ proved to be only a temporary set-back. It was accepted as a challenge, and plans for future developments began to take form."





President Brandenburg was constantly urging teachers to prepare themselves "to render more efficient service without waiting to be prodded by rising standards of qualifications, which he predicted would surely come. And he was continually striving for improvement in the facilities and offerings of the teacher training institutions."

"One of the significant and lasting contributions of the Brandenburg administration is to be found in the stimulus to improve in the professional qualifications of members of the instructional staff of the College". This is a contribution that has been made by every administration of the college.

It was also during the Brandenburg administration that the "transformation of the Manual Training Normal School into a College for Teachers, both in act and in name, and in raising the standards of the institution to the point where it merited and received recognition as a liberal arts college also" took place. It was during this period, too, that a course in graduate studies was inaugurated.



President Brandenburg was succeeded upon his death in 1940 by Dr. O. P. Dellinger and by Dr. Rees H. Hughes in 1941. Both administrations succeeded admirably in helping the college grow.

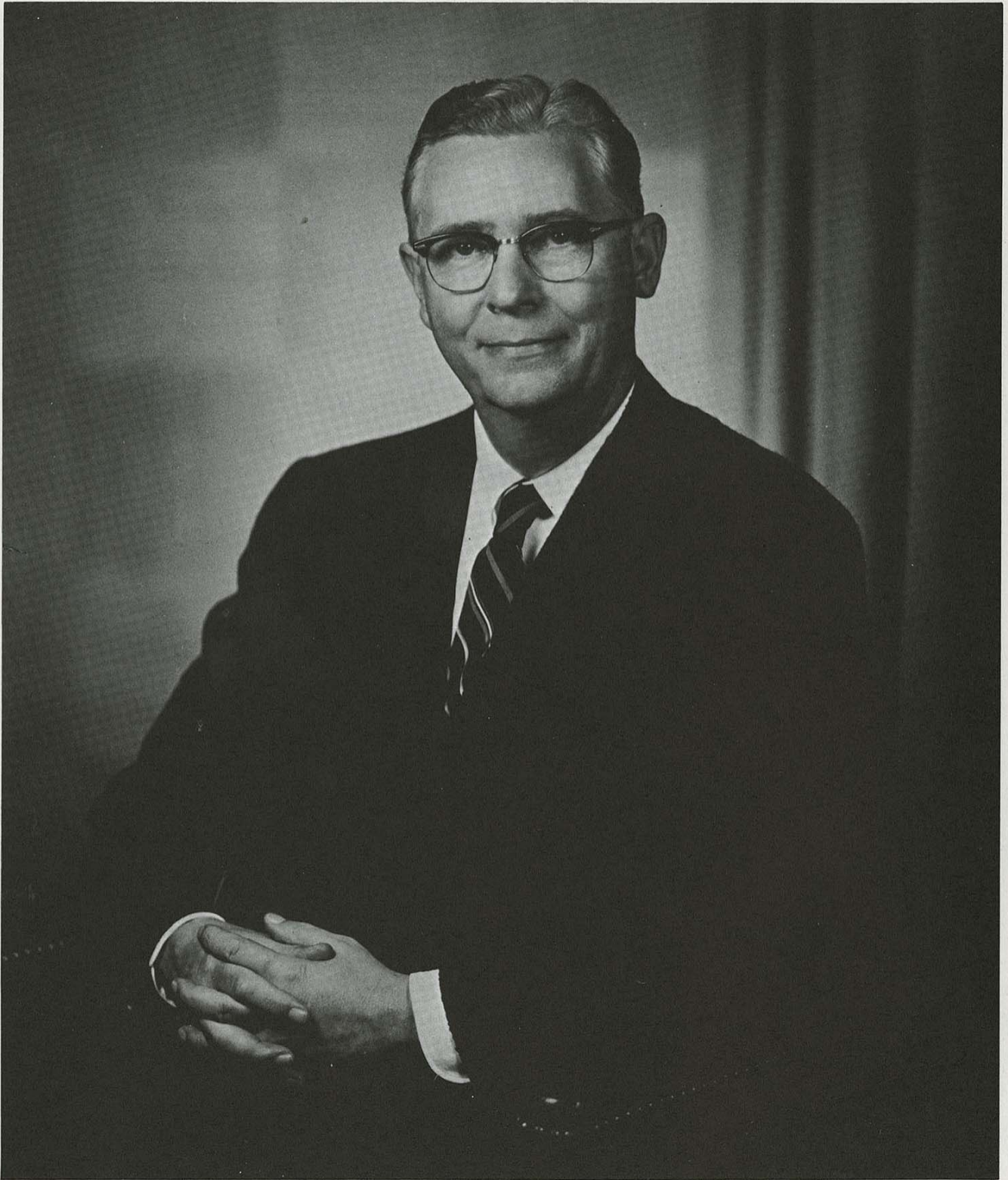
Today, President Leonard H. Axe is continuing the tradition of growth and progress for the College. With an eventful past and the expectancy of an eventful future for the College, President Axe and his administration have done much to improve the academic standards at Kansas State. During his term of office we have again had the name of the college changed, more emphasis has been placed on intellectual growth, and many additional resources now help the members of the student body obtain the most from their education.

New buildings are in the planning, new courses are offered, and additions have been made to the faculty and facilities. The future is bright for Kansas State College—as we continue to Square The Oval.

## Board of Regents

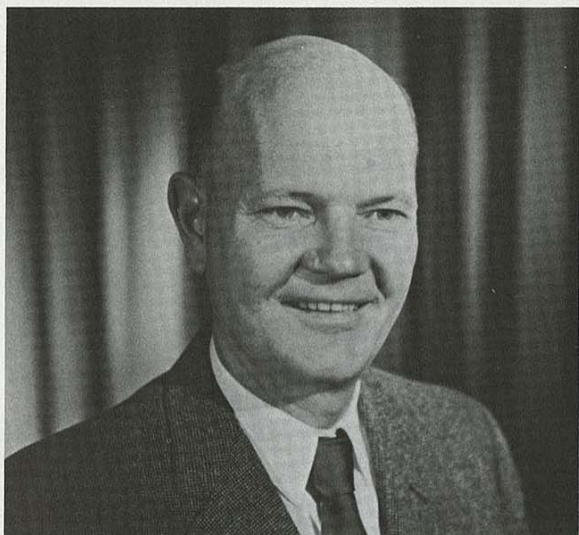
The Board of Regents is made up of ten public-spirited men who largely determine the policies of the College. It is the responsibility of these men to approve the selection of faculty and administrative officers.

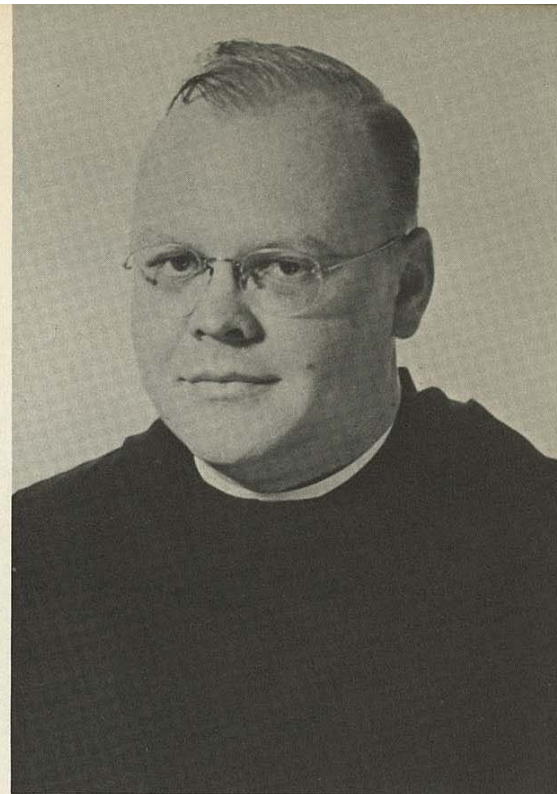


## Religious Emphasis Days

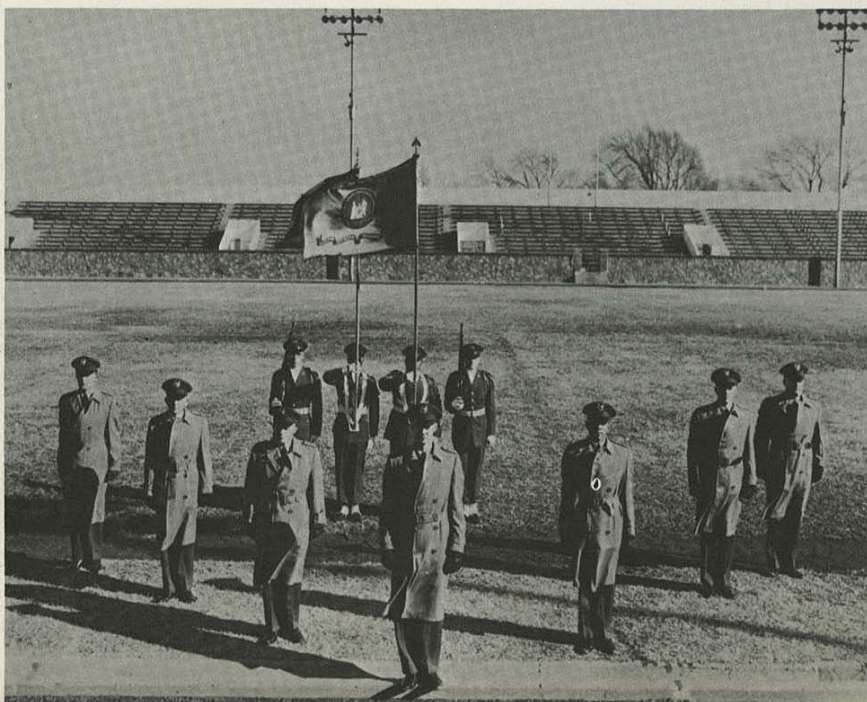

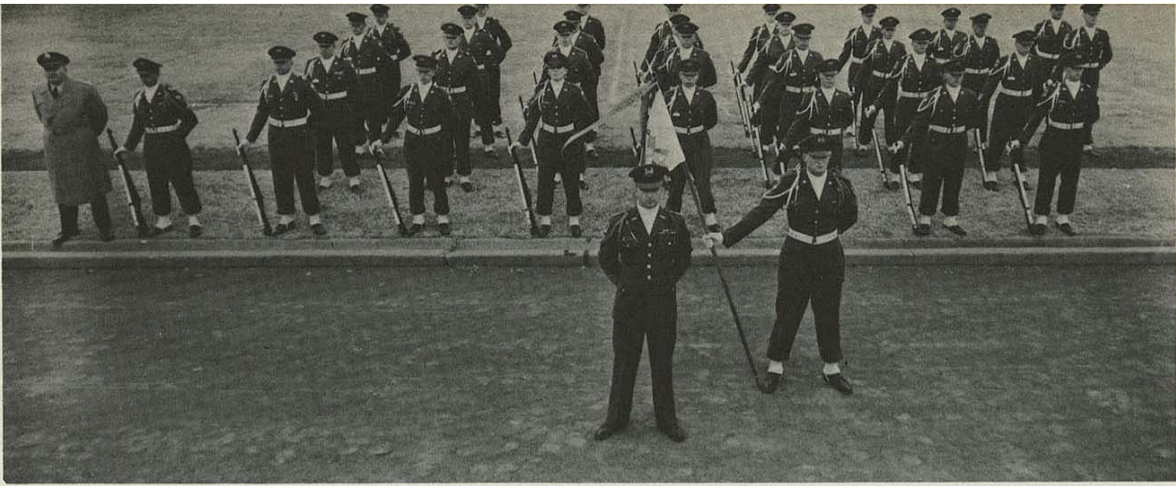
## Army ROTC Band

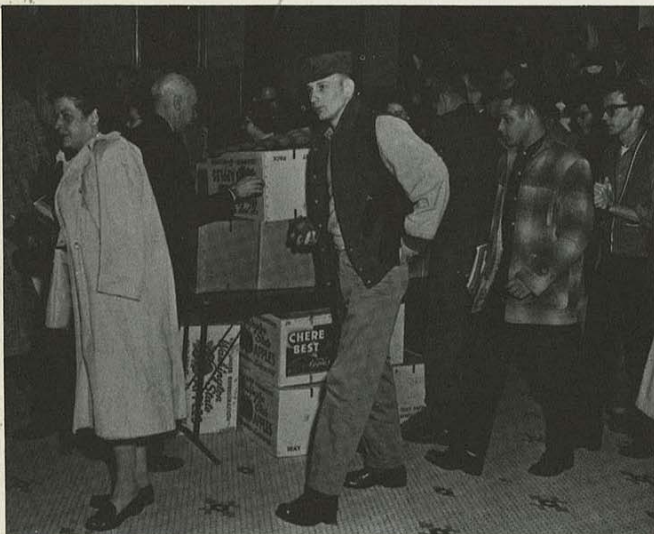
# Commemoration Day

Virginia is an excellent student and is recognized as a campus leader. She well deserves this honor.



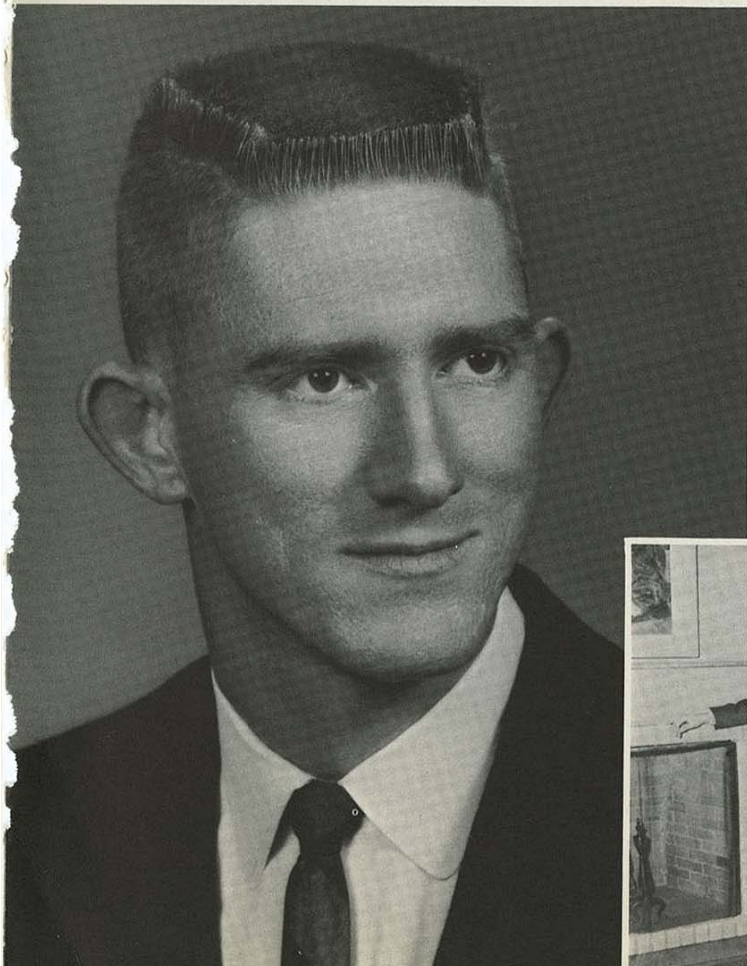

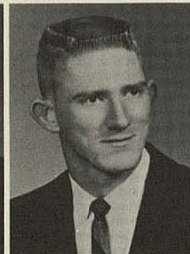

October 16, 1959, Jan Peerce, tenor of the Metropolitan Opera Company, brought us a program that looked awesome but enchanted us to the end.



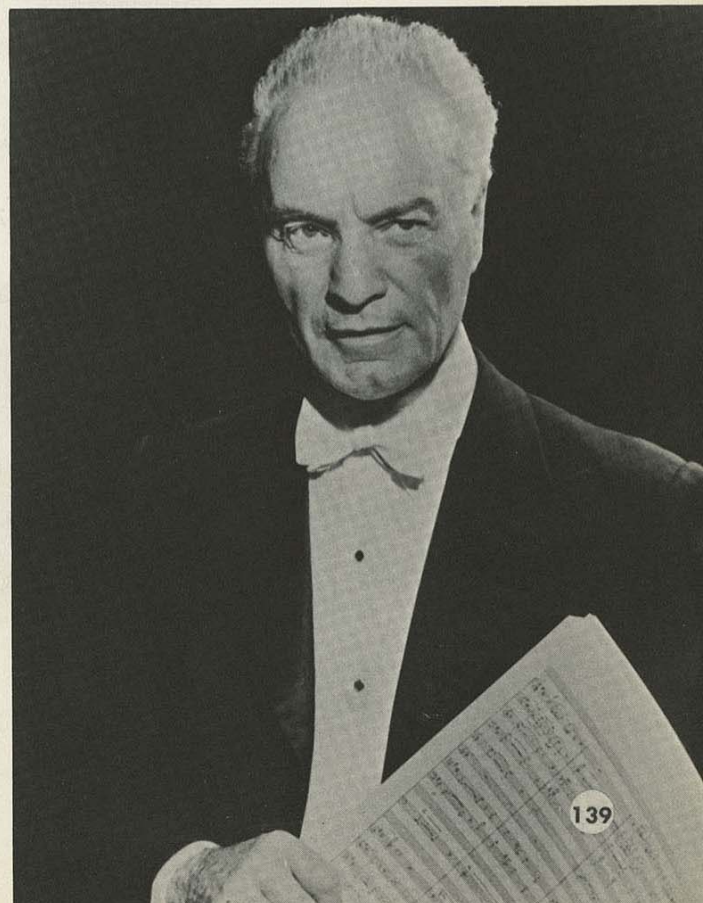

Associated Women Students is the women's governing body at Kansas State College of Pittsburg of which every regularly enrolled woman student is a member. This organization works to unify the women students and allows them to speak and act as a body.

The legislative power of AWS is vested in a Women's Council, consisting of representatives from all regularly enrolled women students. Recognizing that it is the responsibility of Associated Women Students to promote high standards and ideals and to create an atmosphere of friendly co-operation, the Women's Council has established rules for the self-government of all under-graduate women.

Any infraction of regulations that does not come under supervision of the Dean of Women or the Discipline Committee is handled by the Judicial Committee of Associated Women Students. The members of the Judicial Committee are nominated by the Nominating Committee and voted on by all women students. Two girls representing each class are elected, making a group of eight on the Judicial Committee.

AWS sponsors a Women's Day each spring which is devoted to presenting programs for all women in areas of particular interest. A winter semi-formal dance is sponsored co-operatively by AWS and the Student Council. In the fall, a delegation of girls attended the State AWS Convention at Washburn University in Topeka, Kansas. In the spring they will attend the Regional Conference at Missouri University in Columbia, Missouri.

Giving women the responsibility of making their own regulations and enforcing them contributes to harmonious living at Kansas State College of Pittsburg.

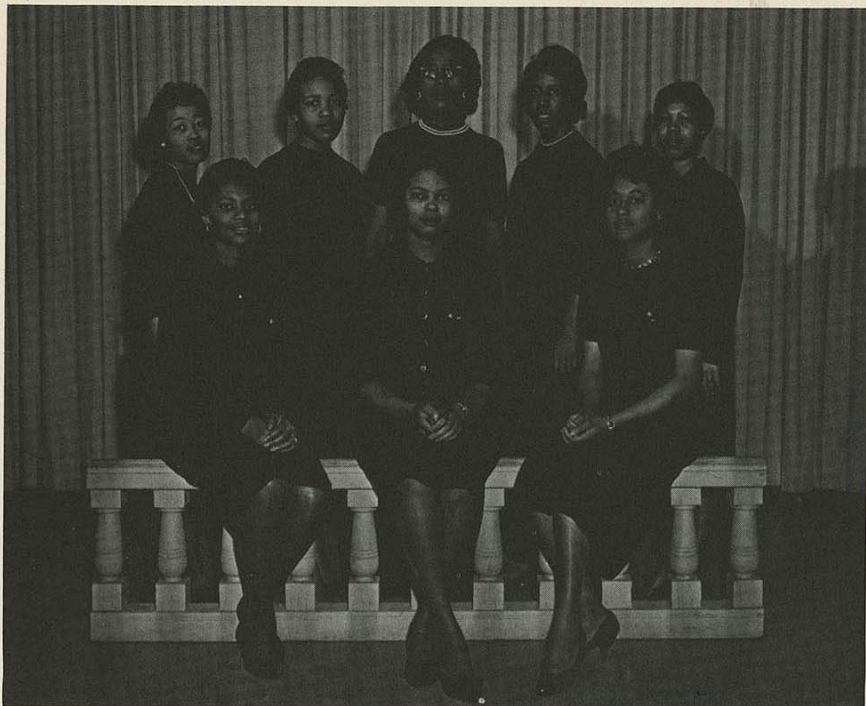

## Champs Go To NAIA

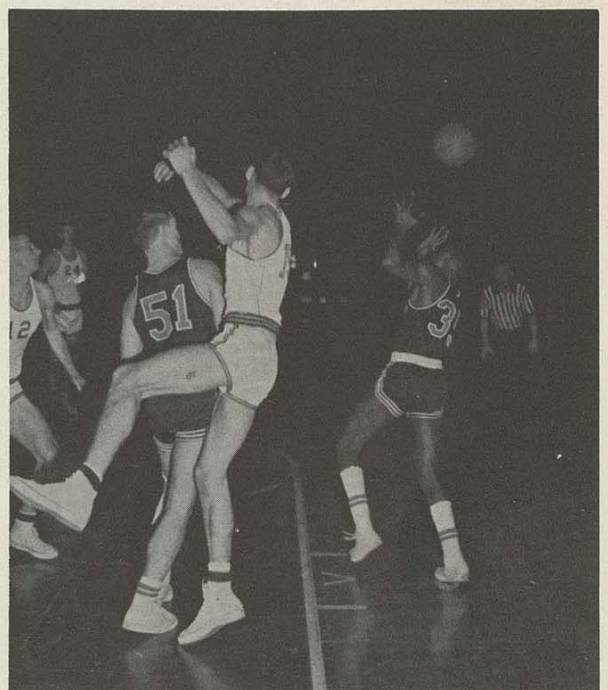
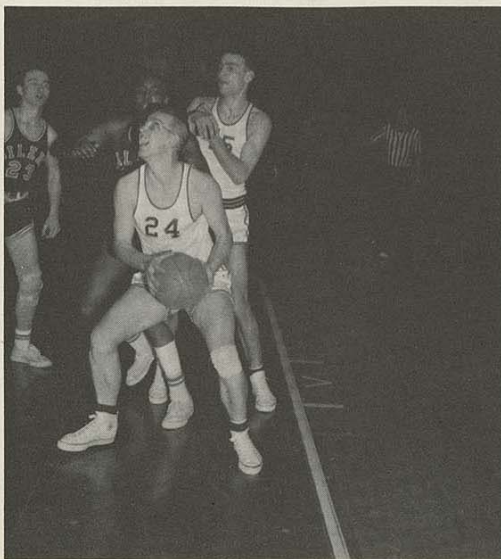

In the NAIA tournament Pittsburg drew Findlay College of Ohio and after a close first half let the Oilers coast to a 76-61 victory.

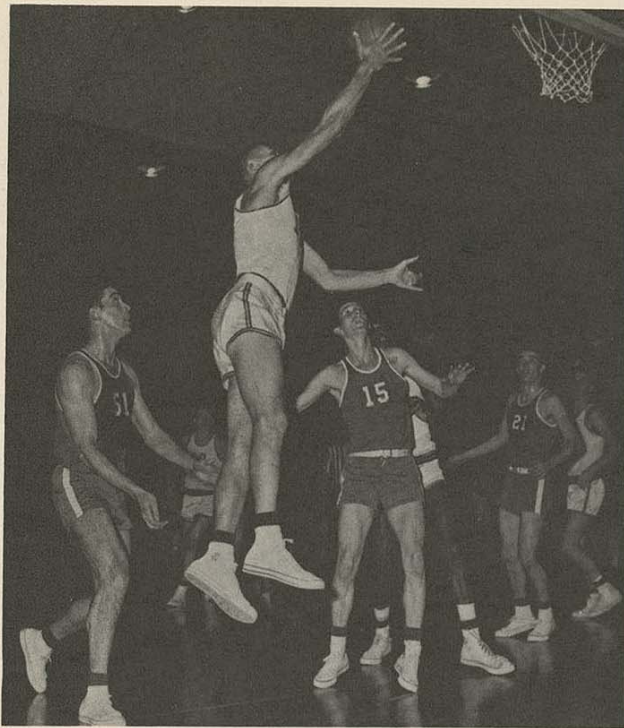
