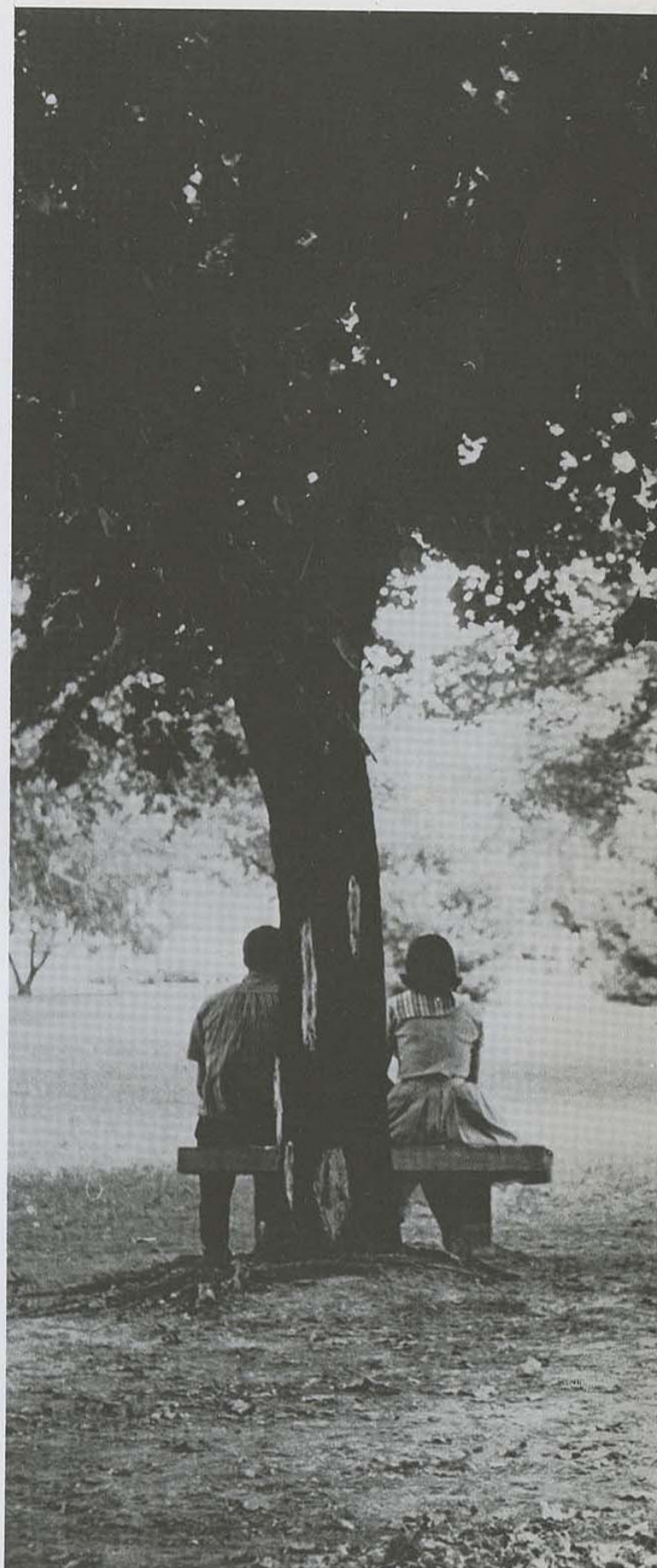
"In its true sense education seeks to train the mind. The fundamental objective of a college or university is to train minds. Information is important, but information and education are not synonymous. The dissemination and acquisition of information are vital processes in a college or university but they are not the ultimate goal. An individual does not become a success in any line of endeavor by virtue of spending four years listening to others describe how it is done and memorizing those descriptions."



"There is an old adage by John Heywood which says, 'A man may well bring a horse to water, but he cannot make him drink without he will.' I would apply that adage to higher education and it would go something like this. 'You can lead a student to education, you can even force him to take a mouthful, but you cannot make him swallow it.' To put it simply, true education cannot take place without the consent, cooperation, and participation of the student. The great teacher is a teacher who is able to secure that consent, cooperation and participation from his students. The successful student is one who participates freely. He is one who also takes full advantage of the existence on the campus of fine libraries, concert series, art exhibits and theatrical productions. As the Bible says, 'Man does not live by bread alone.'"

"American higher education will never succeed in its goal of giving higher quality education to increasing numbers of students until the nation recognizes the true objective of the process of education and what must be done in order to achieve it. When that happens, students will enter college with the realization that education is something to get into, not something to be resisted or avoided. They will know and accept, as right and just, that the ultimate responsibility for his own education rests with the student. If this understanding and acceptance occurs, we will manage to get the job done. I have too much confidence in the basic intelligence of the American people, particularly the young people, to believe that our job is doomed to failure. I am confident that we will ultimately succeed."

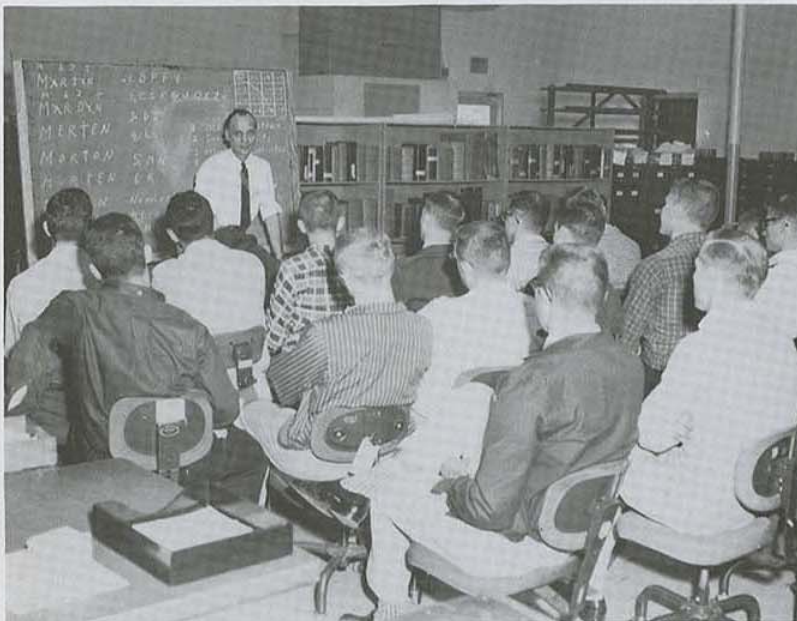

Gold Key

The Gold Key Society is the honorary organization for junior and senior men, selected on the basis of leadership, scholarship, character, student activities, and service.

When inquiry developed that there were no campus-wide honor societies in existence, a number of interested faculty members, faculty wives, and friends of the College were invited by the President to study the need for and the possibility of organizing such societies. As a result of the study, Gold Key and Golden Crest were founded in the spring of 1958.

Dr. Dudley T. Cornish, Dr. Leo M. Ensman, Mr. Carnie Smith, Dr. Theodore M. Sperry, Dr. Leonard H. Axe, and Dr. Walter Pennington were the Advisory Board of Gold Key.

Membership is limited to three classes of membership: Active, Alumni, and Honorary. The Active members are men students who qualify as seniors of the college. They are the only voting members, being active only one year. Alumni members are all of those who belonged to the Gold Key Society when they were in college. Honorary members are persons who are members of the faculty or community who generally meet the standards of the society and who are elected by the active members to a non-voting membership.

The qualifications are: a minimum requirement of a 1.8 overall grade-point average, enrollment at time of election to complete at least 85 hours of credit, and one semester of resident study at the college with the completion of not less than fourteen hours of college credit which shall average 1.8 or better.

The advisory board consists of three persons selected by the active members from among alumni or honorary members. Each is a member of the faculty or administration of the college when elected to serve a three-year term.

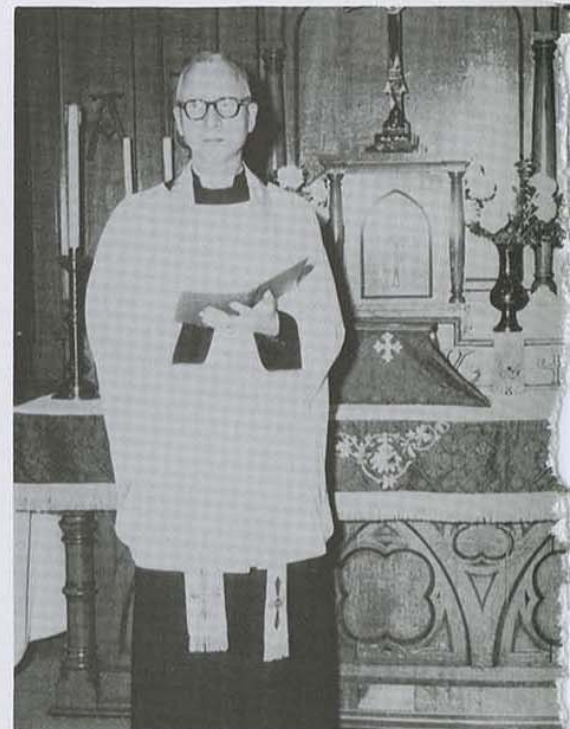

The true story of the tradition as told by Mr. Russell S. Russ, first head of this College, is as follows. His story is that on March 7, 1905, when he had been sitting in the House of Representatives at Topeka, he was called over to the Senate. While he was gone, House members jokingly agreed to enforce an existing law which prohibited non-members from sitting on the House floor. They decided that offenders should be fined a barrel of apples. When Mr. Russ returned, he took a seat on the floor and was soon ordered to produce a barrel of apples for his misdemeanor.

When the administrator returned to Pittsburg, he told the students of the event and suggested that they prepare a proclamation to fine the faculty a barrel of apples in honor of the appropriation.

Apple Day is the event to be revered and fostered in the hearts of students, faculty members and graduates as belonging only to this campus. It is the personal tradition of Kansas State College of Pittsburg.

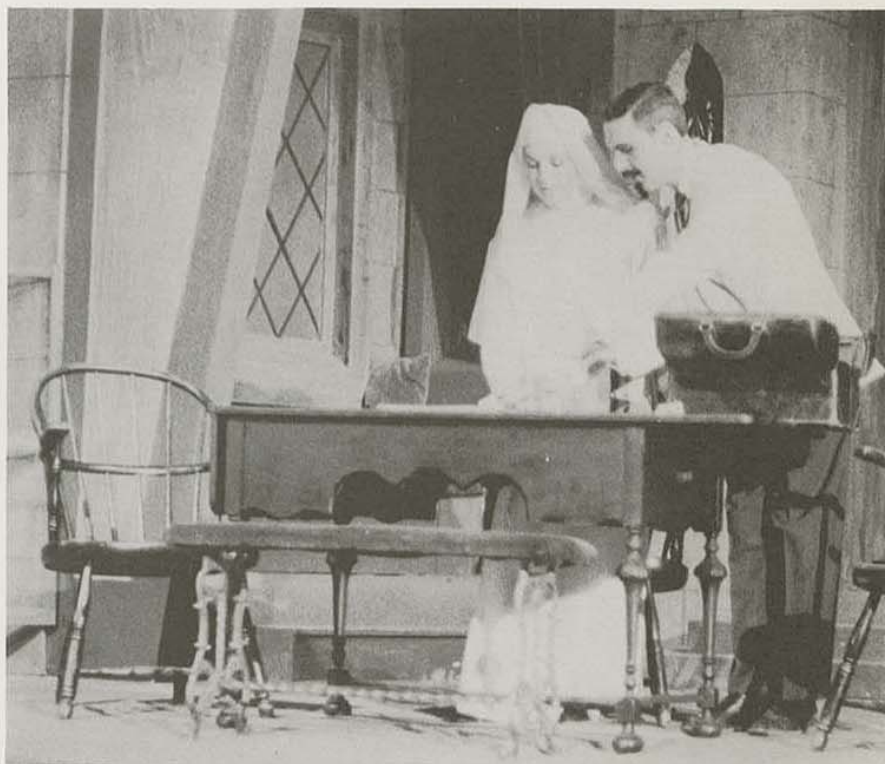

Kansas State College of Pittsburg

SENATE BILL No. 14

AN Act changing the name of the Kansas state teachers college of Pittsburg to that of Kansas state college of Pittsburg, prescribing certain powers, duties and jurisdiction, amending section 76-618 of the General Statutes of 1949, and repealing said original section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

SECTION 1. Section 76-618 of the General Statutes of 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 76-618. The name of Kansas state teachers college of Pittsburg is hereby changed to the Kansas state college of Pittsburg. All properties, moneys, appropriations, rights and authorities now vested in the state teachers college of Pittsburg shall be vested in the Kansas state college of Pittsburg.

SEC. 2. Section 76-618 of the General Statutes of 1949 is hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official state paper.

New Name—New Role

The name Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg went into past history March 12, 1959, as Governor George Docking signed the official document changing the name of the institution to Kansas State College of Pittsburg, the Senate and House having previously passed the bill authorizing the change.

The institution thus assumes its fourth official title. In 1903, when Senate Bill No. 234 was passed, establishing the school, the name was Auxiliary Manual Training Normal School at Pittsburg. In 1913 the school was authorized to drop the term Auxiliary and change its name to Kansas State Manual Training Normal of Pittsburg.

Under the presidency of W. A. Brandenburg, the nature of the institution underwent gradual changes until in 1923 the Legislature recognized that the school had become a college for teachers embracing liberal arts as well as industrial and vocational subjects and authorized the change of name to Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg.

Now, some 36 years later, the Legislature has again recognized the expanded role of the college and has officially changed its name to Kansas State College of Pittsburg.

Upon the recommendation of the Board of Regents, the Legislature has officially recognized the expanded role of the College at Pittsburg. Official recognition of its status as a regional college may well be one of the most significant events in the history of the College.

We always have been proud of our mission as a teacher training institution, and we intend to so continue. We also are making other contributions to the welfare of the citizens of Kansas, and we believe this name change to be significant to our continued success in those areas.

The faculty, staff and students of the College are proud of its achievements, and they are both proud and grateful that its growth and maturity have been recognized in this fashion.—President Leonard H. Axe.

Pittsburg's 1958 gridiron crew, first generation descendants of the 1957 Gorilla football team that re-wrote record books in its surge to the national small college championship, didn't have time to rest on the laurels of their predecessors, but jostled into a rugged 10-game schedule and emerged second in final league standings.

The re-building Gorillas anticipated the strain and pressures that were sure to accompany defense of the Holiday Bowl title and fought off being completely "psyched" when they realized their schedule called for meeting four of the five conference foes in unfriendly homecoming battles.

Southwest Missouri State becalmed the Gorillas' 12-game victory wake in the second 1958 game that saw the Bruins win 7-6 after a hard-fought battle of similar T-formations and like 7-2-2 defenses. Kirksville fell 21-12 to the Gorillas in the season opener after Pitt overcame a 12-0 halftime deficit.

Warrensburg capitalized on a blocked punt to tie Pitt 19-19. A wobbly field goal that nearly scraped the goal post center-piece was Rolla's vehicle in a 22-21 last-minute win over the Gorillas and St. Benedict's re-vengeed its single defeat of the 1957 season with a 26-19 victory over Pitt.





The Gorillas were not at full strength against Fort Hays, and the Tigers shouldered into the CIC title race with a 16-7 homecoming victory.

Pitt flailed Washburn 13-6 at homecoming and then dealt Emporia a 20-14 crushing blow on Brandenburg field.

The Gorilla win over Emporia handed St. Benedict's the central conference title as it eliminated the last team with a mathematical title chance. Underdog Washburn upset Fort Hays 19-6, St. Benedict's defeated Emporia, and the Gorillas slid into second place in loop standing with a 25-19 win over Southwestern that saw the Gorillas overcome the 19-0 margin which the Builders held going into the last canto.

Finally came Northeast Oklahoma of Tahlequah, the team rated the top in the nation as the season closed and the team which defeated St. Benedict's 19-14 in a semi-final of the Holiday Bowl at Tulsa and later toppled Arizona State for the Bowl title in St. Petersburg, Florida. Tahlequah directed its split-T formation against Pitt and came up with a 229 yard passing attack good for a 40-3 victory.
